## Golf league successful; Knights serve outing

"We were well pleased with our first year of operation as the Seton Council Golf League and are looking forward to an expanded league next year."

The observation was made by league co-chairmen J.B. Boblett and John Pizzuto following 18 weeks of competition, which ended in August.

A total of 21 Seton Knights (seven teams) participated in the 18-week league held at Valley View County Club. Handicaps ranged from 6 to 28.

A trio of Pizzuto, Dave Strominger and Bob Wolf led the league with a total of 33 points, while runner-up honors went to the team of Mark Dembski, John Morrison and Terry Thompson with 26.5 points.

Right behind with 26 points was the threesome of Rob Allen, Joe Rossi and Joe Drignat. Other league golfers included Father Steve Hawkins.

Two scrambles added to the enjoyment of league play. The most recent scramble was won by a foursome of Boblett, Drignat, Tim Bowie and Steve Walter.

Bud Joos, a league member who served as secretary, reported the following:

• Wolf was "most improved," dropping his handicap from 26 to 16.

• Allen Luther was "strongest swinger," somehow denting the face of his driver by simply hitting a golf ball.

• Rob Allen was "best improviser," bending his four iron on a tree.

An initial organizational meeting for play in 1998 will be held in mid-January at a time and place to be announced. Boblett noted the league next summer could accommodate up to 40 golfers and invited interested Knights to contact him or Pizzuto via the church mailbox.
