Boy, did we put on one heck of a wives appreciation dinner this year?





Catholic Men's Conference

On Saturday, November 6th, a Catholic Men's Conference, sponsored by the Catholic Men's Fellowship of Central Ohio, was held at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Grove City.

Steve Newman, the man who walked around the world, and Dr. Lou Jantaglia, psychiatrist, were two of the dynamic speakers that addressed the conference. The speakers stressed the importance of not giving up, even in the face of extreme adversity, and to invoke God's help to see you through troubled times.

As significant number of priests attended the conference and heard confessions during the late morning. The conference concluded with a concelebrated mass with the Pastor, Monsignor Romano, as the main celebrant.

Ten Knights from our Council attended the conference, including Fran Vendetta, Bud Joos, Carl Kipp, George Williams, Dick Peterson, Hector Raymond, Mike Welling, Joe Rossi, John Hamilton, and Bob Wolf.

4th Degree

The Southern Ohio District Fourth Degree Exemplification will be held April 7, 8, and 9th, 2000, at the Crown Plaza Hotel in downtown Dayton, Ohio. All Third Degree Knights that have been Knights for at least 6 months are eligible (over 60 in the council!).

The Exemplification fee is \$65, which includes the Banquet for the Candidate. All Candidates will be responsible for obtaining their own sword and baldric. There are two types of swords — plain and etched. Lynch and Kelly offers the plain sword for \$89, and the etched sword for \$98. The English Company also offers swords. K & G in the Short North offers the service baldric for \$15.75. I will give a pair of white gloves to each council member that becomes a Fourth Degree this time.

Banquet dinners for guests are \$30. The Ladies' Brunch is \$12. Hotel rooms are \$79 per night (identify yourself as a Knight when making the reservation). The cutoff date for reservations at the Crown Plaza is March 17th, 2000. Make your reservations early. The hotel's reservation phone number is (937)224-0800.

Dress for candidates is a black tuxedo, white tuxedo shirt with lay-down collar (not the collar with little tabs). Dress for current Fourth Degree Knights: tuxedo for the Banquet, full regalia for the Exemplification. Ladies: formal dress for the Banquet, dressy casual for the Ladies' Brunch.

There will be a Mass 3:00 PM Saturday the nearby St. Joseph's Church.

More information regarding the menu and other items will be sent out after the first of the year. It may seem like a long way in the future, but it's coming quickly. Call me if you are interested in becoming a Fourth Degree Knight, or if you have any questions.

Holy Year Door Program for

Columbus Famili

a few short weeks, we will be privileged to share in a profound event: the 2.000th anniversary of Christ's birth. According to our Holy Father Pope John Paul II, the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000 is meant to be "a great prayer of praise and thanksgiving, especially for the gift of the Incarnation of the Son of God and of the Redemption which He accomplished" (Tertio Millennio Adveniente, 32).

For several years, we as a Church and as an Order have

been preparing for the Jubilee Year through our Family Hour of Prayer for the New Millennium program and our Jubilee 2000 membership campaign.

This Advent, which begins Nov. 28, Knights of Columbus families are urged to make the "Open Wide the Doors to Christ" family prayer program printed on the next page a major part of their preparation for Christmas and the Great Jubilee.

Our prayer program takes its cue from the Holy Father, who on Christmas Eve will open the Holy Door in the Maderno Atrium of St. Peter's Basilica, newly restored by the Knights of Columbus as a gift to the univerthe great church and thus commence the

Great Jubilee of the Year 2000. Both the opening of the Holy Door and the Midnight Mass from St. Peter's Basilica will be telecast to a global audience thanks to the Knights of Columbus.

One of the most symbolic activities of the Holy Year will be the opening of the Holy Door on Christmas Eve and its closing on the feast of the Epiphany on Jan. 6, 2001. The Holy Door is the most important door offering access to St. Peter's Basilica. Passage through the Holy Door sym-

bolizes one's passage from sin to new life in Christ.

In 1983, during a Holy Year proclaimed by Pope John Paul II, he said the Holy Door "must be a sign and symbol of the new closeness to Christ, who is man's savior." On Christmas Eve. Pope John Paul will lead the faithful into the third Christian millennium when he steps over the threshold of the door and into St. Peter's Basilica to celebrate Midnight Mass.

By partaking in this "Open Wide the Doors to Christ" program, Knights and their families will be prepared to cross the threshold of the new millennium committed to prosal Church in the Jubilee Year. The pope will tecting and defending our Church, our councross the threshold of the Holy Door into try, our families and the dignity and sanctity of every human life.



Holy Year Door Program for Knights of Columbus Families

STEP 1 - FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

a. On the First Sunday of Advent, Nov. 28, designate a room or closer that can remain locked until Dec. 24. (If none can be spared, use a cabinet with a door.) Carefully remove the poster of the Holy Door found on pages 16-17 of the November issue of Columbia. The father affixes the poster to the chosen door, which now becomes the family's Holy Door for the Jubilee.

b. The family gathers near the door. The father opens the program by praying:

"In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

"Blessed are you, O Lord our God, for you guide our footsteps. You bless our coming in and our going out; from birth to death, you hold us in your care.

"Bless this door, O Lord, which we consecrate at this time of preparation. Each time we pass this place, draw us ever more deeply into your Presence so that we may know the wonders of your love for us."

e. Next, the mother of the family or a child places the Baby Jesus from the family Nativity creche on a pallow inside the room to be locked.

d. The mother of the family offers the following prayer:

"Heavenly Father, we place this symbol of your unborn Son in your care. We await his birth and with it a celebration of new life, hope and peace through out the world. As we await the new millennium, we ask for your blessings on our family and on all Knights of Columbus families throughout the world. Protect this unborn child and all unborn children so that they may have a chance at life, a chance to carry your love and blessings to all they meet, following in your Son's footsteps. Amen."

e. The father now locks the door.

STEP 2 - DAILY/SUNDAYS OF ADVENT

a. During Advent, every time a family member passes by the door, he or she should pause and offer a Hail Mary or a brief ejaculation, such as "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us."

b.On each Sunday of Advent, a family member leads the family in a prayer in front of the Holy Door. This may be done following the lighting of the Advent wreath candle or any other suitable time.

STEP 3 - CHRISTMAS EVE

a. On Christmas Eve, the family gathers once again around the family Holy Door. The father opens the door and offers the following prayer:

"In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

"You are the door to the Kingdom of God, the sheep gate to life eternal, O portal of eternal peace, our new and living way. Loose our sins and open for us the door to salvation.

"We now open wide this door to Christ and carry the Baby Jesus to his crib. Tonight we celebrate the birth of our Savior 2,000 years ago in Bethlehem. We look forward to the Jubilee Year, and we ask for your blessings, dear God, in the name of your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ. Amen."

b. The youngest child takes the Baby Jesus and leads the family in procession to the Nativity set and places the figurine into the crib. The family sings "Silent Night" or some other suitable Christmas hymn during the procession.
