

George Williams, Mike Welling, Fran Vendetta, Mike Croyle, and John Hamilton each said one decade of the rosary.


# Chancellor's Challenge

Tony Fortkamp, Director of the Fairfield Industries Adult Program also spoke before the business meeting. They assist about 90 people who can work at jobs such as packaging, repackaging, and collating. They are paid on speed and ability. There are also about 80 people who cannot work.

He described Emory, who was at first bedridden, but after receiving a special wheelchair is now able to move around on a limited basis.

# Knights of Columbus Council 11187 Publicity Request Guidelines

Publicity can be an important part of your event, helping to ensure larger turnouts. It also helps to thank those that have helped out. However, publicity cannot be left until the last minute. It takes time to get articles published. In all cases, leave the article in my church mailbox, or E-mail me the pertinent information at joe\_drignat@prodigy.com. If you leave the article in my church mailbox, please call me at (614)866-1134 to let me know it is there.

- Church Bulletin: articles must be submitted to the church by Monday of the week you want them to appear. Give articles to me by preceding Friday at the latest.
- Local Newspapers: articles must be submitted by the Monday at least 2 weeks prior to the event —
   3 weeks would be safer it has taken 3 weeks several times.
- Special requests in Church Mailboxes: Allow a week after you give me the request. If you want
  something for the end of the month, give me the article two weeks prior, because I work on the
  newsletter the last week of the month. If you want the article put into all the church mailboxes, you
  will have to arrange for help to stuff the mailboxes.
- Council 11187 Newsletter: I try to get the newsletter in the mailboxes by the first Saturday of the month, time permitting, so I need articles by the Friday prior to the last full week of the month.
- Other Special Request: If you have another place you want your article published, please call me so

  I can contact the publication for lead times.

Remember to answer the questions "Who, What, Why, Where, When". Also include information like prices, who can attend (Knights only or general public), menu items, etc. Please check the spelling of names and places, and print or type the article. I will attempt to keep the article as close to your original submission as possible, but I may have to edit it for some publications.
