Dear Brother Knights,

The following information was obtained while surfing the Supreme Knights of Columbus web pages concerning the history of the 3rd Degree Emblem. I thought it would be interesting to share this with you.



The Emblem of the order dates from the Second Supreme meeting, May 12, 1883, when it was designed by James T. Mullen, who was then the first Supreme Knight. A quick glance at the emblem indicates a shield mounted upon the cross of Malta. The Shield is that associated with a medieval Knight. The Cross of Malta is the representation in a traditionally artistic design of the Cross of Christ through which all graces of redemption were procured for mankind. This then, represents the Catholic spirit of the Order.

Mounted on the shield are three objects, a mace standing vertically, and crossed behind it, an anchor and a dagger or short sword. The mace from Roman days is symbolic of authority that must exist in any tightly bonded and efficiently operating organization. The anchor is the mariner's symbol for Columbus, patron of the Order. While the short sword or dagger was the weapon of the Knight when engaged upon an errand of mercy. Thus, the shield expresses Catholic Knighthood in organized merciful action and with the letters K of C, it proclaims this specific form of activity.

The red, white and blue in the background of the shield of the Cross of Malta are the colors of our beloved country. Red is the symbol of stout hearted courage. Blue is the symbol of hope. White is the symbol of nobility of purpose.

Faith... Hope... Charity...

Red is then the symbol of Faith, of belief in Christ, in the Redemptive and in the mission of every man to spread the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. White is the color of the Eucharist, symbolizing that God's presence among men. White is then the symbol of Christ like Charity. Blue is the color of our Lady's mantle, in which she draped her beloved Son, through whom salvation came to a sinful world. Blue is then the symbol of Hope.

Hope you enjoyed this little bit of history.

### Golfers must register at the course at 6:30 on the day of the scramble.

- Each team will consist of four players based on handicap. The teams that
  have a player missing on that day will be instructed on how to play their
  round.
- Each golfer will hit from the white tees on each hole. The team will select the
  best ball for their second shot and each golfer will hit again from that spot.
  This will continue until the ball is in the hole. If a golfer puts a ball into the
  hole before the rest of the team putts that must be counted as an added
  stroke.
- Teams may move the ball one club length but no closer to the hole. However, the ball may not be moved from the rough, sand trap, from out-of-bounds, or from a hazard.
- 4. Your \$10 fee payable at the sign-up; \$5 will be for the first, second and third place teams. \$5 will be for the TOSS. A toss cannot be used in any shot described in number 3 above; from the rough, etc. The toss will not count as a stroke. Each player has one toss; in other words, one player cannot use all four tosses. Mark the card for each player's toss. This fee is payable the morning of the scramble to J. B. Boblett.
- All teams must use at least one from each player off the tee. Par-threes cannot be counted as tee shots. Mark on the score card whose drive was used on each hole.
- Please turn in your score cards to J.B. Boblett at the end your round. The last group will be responsible to pick up the skill prize sheets.
- Thanks for playing in the league and the scramble. Party to follow at Bud & Terri Joos' house after all the golfers have finished. We will present the prizes at the party.
- Registration is for K of C Members only. Wives are welcome to come to the party. The cost for the meal is \$12 per person.
