CATHOLIC ENDOWMENT FUND—BY BOG GLAVIN

Catholic Education Endowment Fund

During the October monthly meeting a proposal was made to establish a fraternal endowment fund for the purpose of recognizing, encouraging and rewarding excellence in Catholic education. From our present general funds \$2000 would be allocated for this purpose. These funds along with voluntary private contributions would be invested and proceeds used to recognize excellence in Catholic education in future years.

The primary beneficiaries would be students at Seton Parish grade school should a school be established.

Also, Seton C.C.D. students and students attending Catholic High Schools or other Catholic grade schools would be candidates for awards.



Private donations into the fund may qualify for naming rights for an award distributed from this fund. For example, if "John Smith" contributed \$500 into the fund he might elect to perpetually have his name used in association with the "K of C,

Council 11187—John Smith—Mathematics Award" awarded to the Seton eight-grader who receives the highest score on a standardized test. Other awards may also be distributed from the fund to academically qualified family members of sponsoring Knights from council 11187.

It is intended that this proposal besides serving its intended purpose will present our Council in a positive manner. Further, it is a mechanism by which the academic achievement of Brother Knight family members can be recognized and reward for their academic accomplishments.
