#### What's Going On Out There!

As I write this, one news item of the day informs us that there is an outbreak of Foot and Mouth Disease in Great Britain. This animal disease report replaced the news item of two weeks ago about the discovery of Mad Cow Disease in Germany. The German nation thought that the precautions they were taking would bar the Mad Cow Disease from their country. But the disease did appear in Germany.

The United States created an agency in the early 1900's, which now operates as the USDA Plant and Animal Inspection Service (APHIS). This agency was charged to prevent certain untreatable diseases from being imported into this country. The focus of this agency has shifted over time from horse diseases to cattle, swine and poultry.

I attended the annual Ohio Veterinary Medical Association meeting last month and while attending the outbreak of Foot and Mouth disease was discovered in Great Britain. Most people are not aware nor does the media report that in the 1950's Foot and Mouth Disease was very common in Mexico. As the disease was considered a threat to our livestock in the southwest, the United States and Mexico cooperated to inspect all the cattle in Mexico and proceed on a slaughter/ vaccination program to eliminate the disease in our border country. Of course there was local opposition in some areas because of religion and fears that the gringos were there to cause more oppression that already existed in their poor land. The overall results were beneficial

to Mexico. Not only did they now have cattle to sell for the American dollar, but the poor family had cattle, sheep and swine that were many times more productive since they were not lame and could barely eat enough to stay alive. The only good thing about Foot and Mouth Disease is that is not contagious to humans.

Another disease that was eliminated from cattle for some time was Bovine Tuberculosis. I was involved in the testing of cattle herds in my locality when I was in large animal practice. We thought that as of several years ago that we would not see this disease again in our livestock. But as of the past year the state of Michigan has lost their accreditation status as TB free. This time the disease was not shipped in, but the infection came for the white tail deer population.

It seems that even the best precautions sometimes are not enough. But the lesson to be learned from all of this is to be vigilant. There are many that stand vigilant that we may enjoy our abundant way of life. We too must be vigilant to always be ready for unexpected.

Now the challenge: are you being vigilant in your everyday living?




