




2006 Annual Charity Raffle



Women Deserve Better Than Abortion

In *Evangelium vitae* (1995), no. 72, Pope John Paul II wrote about the Pro-choice mindset:

“Utilitarianism is a civilization of production and of use, a civilization of “things” and not of “persons”, a civilization in which persons are used in the same way as things are used. In the context of a civilization of use, woman can become an object for man, children a hindrance to parents, the family an institution obstructing the freedom of its members. To be convinced that this is the case, one need only look at certain sexual education programs introduced into the schools, often notwithstanding the disagreement and even the protests of many parents; or pro-abortion tendencies which vainly try to hide behind the so-called “right to choose” (“pro-choice”) on the part of both spouses, and in particular on the part of the woman.”

This mindset of using women has led to their degradation and to treating them as objects for sexual gratification. This in turn has led to abortion as a way to deal with the consequences of this “sexual liberation”. It is no wonder women are unhappier than ever! Studies, even those sponsored by Planned Parenthood, the largest abortion provider, increasingly find that women are harmed by abortion and regret their abortions. Many are depressed and suicidal for years afterward. In an article on the USCCB website titled “Women Deserve Better Than Abortion”, Cathleen A. Cleaver writes:

“Thirty years ago, all laws against abortion throughout the country collapsed when the Supreme Court changed the Constitution without our consent. Abortion was declared the supreme law of the land, and what followed was a social experiment using the lives of women and children as its primary subjects.

For thirty years the abortion experiment has been dominated by a public debate that embraces an utterly false dichotomy: women versus children. Pro-lifers are seen as those who fight for unborn children, pro-choicers as those who fight for women. Women and children are of course natural allies, not enemies, and pro-lifers fight for women every day, but the terms of the debate have been set, and they have held.

The fight for children has made some gains. Thanks to the sustained efforts of the pro-life movement -- and some marvelous developments in science and technology -- fewer people now question the humanity of the unborn child. People generally accept the fact that abortion is bad for unborn children.”

Still, abortion is accepted in our culture. Why?

Because the other side of the abortion debate has offered up the false assumption that abortion is good for women, and the culture has swallowed it. It is time to challenge this assumption head-on. “Only a tiny fraction of abortions today are for health reasons or rape, the pro-choice movement’s favorite justifications for abortion. The reality is that women turn to abortion because they feel alone and helpless, or abandoned, or pressured by boyfriends or family members. Abortion is not the act of empowerment it was promised to be. Women choose abortion as a last resort, not a free choice. Even the Alan Guttmacher Institute, Planned Parenthood’s

research affiliate, reports that the primary reasons women have abortions are a lack of financial resources and emotional support.

The website www.afterabortion.com -- very clearly not a pro-life site -- is a forum for women who are suffering from the effects of their abortions. On this site women share their pain, their remorse, their anger, and their profound loneliness. It is utterly heartbreaking, and should be required reading for anyone considering supporting Planned Parenthood.”

Women deserve better than this. Women Deserve Better is a campaign supported by a number of pro-woman and pro-life groups to refocus the nation on the reasons why women feel pressured into abortion and to promote women-centered solutions to these problems. (For more information on the campaign, visit www.womensdeservebetter.com). Their message: “Abortion is a reflection that we have not met the needs of women. Women deserve better than abortion.

No teenage girl should have to drop out of school because she became pregnant. No young woman should have to face the prospect of a life of poverty. No one should feel abandoned by her family and friends. And no person should ever have to suffer the pain and anguish of abortion. Pope John Paul II has said that we are called to “a radical solidarity with the woman in need.” Each and every woman deserves better than abortion -- the problems she faces are ours to help solve.”



Business Meeting Minutes for March 8th, 2006

The Meeting Officially Opened at 7:53 P.M. Prior to the opening of the meeting there was a presentation by Mike Shore the development director of Fisher Catholic High School and a presentation of check to George Michael Walsh the director of Human Resources for Easter Seals here in Fairfield County.

Fisher Catholic is a regional High school with students from 5 counties including Fairfield, Franklin, Hocking, Perry, and Ross. 90% of the student population is college bound and 18% of the students are non-Catholic giving the school a very diverse student body. They are very well recognized in academic areas including, Quiz team State champions, Math Skills champions, they have been ranked in Mythology championships several times, and had students in the National Spanish Top 5. Since 1991 98% of the students have went on to secondary education, 72% have went on to Bachelors degrees, 22 % went on to Masters Degrees, and 4% have went on to get a PHD.

Spirituality is strong at Fisher Catholic with more seminary bound students than at any other high school in the area. There is a well attended student Mass every Tue. The current student body is 317 and they would like to continue to grow with the right students.

After the Fisher Catholic presentation a check for \$1,500 was presented to George Michael Walsh on behalf of Easter Seals. Mr. Walsh told us that this money would be used to assist the 14 people in Fairfield county currently be served by them.
