

## What About Capital Punishment?

Recently I was listening to a conservative host on a talk radio show and he asked this interesting question: “*What kind of person supports killing an unborn child but objects to executing a convicted murderer?*”

In general, liberals strongly support abortion but oppose capital punishment while conservatives strongly oppose abortion while they support capital punishment. The liberal stance makes no sense at all, but the conservative argument is persuasive - after all, the child is completely innocent while the criminal has committed some violent act that shows he or she cannot be trusted to safely live in society.

But what does the church have to say about this issue? I looked on the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) website for the answers and found an article by the Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Denver, Colorado, on capital punishment that states in part:

On the surface, the case for capital punishment can seem persuasive. Most people live honestly, act decently and want communities governed by justice – for both the innocent and the guilty. Decent people understandably fear the violence in society. They need to defend their children and themselves. The death penalty has a biblical quality of balance: grievous punishment for grievous crime. Many good people see it as a deterrent to grave evil; and even when the deterrent fails, they reason, at least it can bring justice and emotional closure for the relatives of murder victims.

### WHAT THE CHURCH TEACHES AND WHY

Catholic teaching on the death penalty is not an absolute rejection of lethal force by the state. The death penalty is not intrinsically evil. Both Scripture and long Christian tradition acknowledge the legitimacy of capital punishment under certain circumstances. The Church cannot repudiate that without repudiating her own identity.

Catholic teaching on euthanasia, the death penalty, war, genocide and abortion are rooted in the same concern for the sanctity of the human person. But these different issues do not all have the same gravity or moral content. They are not equivalent.

War can sometimes be legitimate as a form of self-defense. The same can apply, in extraordinary circumstances, to the death penalty. But euthanasia is always an inexcusable attack on the weak. Genocide is always the premeditated murder of entire groups of people. And abortion is always a deliberate assault on a defenseless and innocent unborn child. It can never be justified. It is always - and intrinsically - gravely wrong.

What Catholic teaching on the death penalty does involve is this: a call to set aside unnecessary violence, including violence by the state, in the name of human dignity and the building of a culture of life. In the wake of the bloodiest century in history, the Church invites us to recover our own humanity, choosing God’s higher road of restraint and mercy instead of state-sanctioned killing that implicates all of us as citizens.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains it in these words: If “non-lethal means are sufficient to defend and protect people’s safety from the aggressor [i.e., the convicted murderer], authority [should] limit itself to such means, as these are more in keeping with the concrete conditions of the common good and more in

conformity with the dignity of the human person” (2267).

John Paul II, writing in *The Gospel of Life*, stressed that “the nature and extent of the punishment [for capital crimes] must be carefully evaluated and decided upon, and ought not to go to the extreme of executing the offender except in cases of absolute necessity; in other words, when it would not be possible otherwise to defend society. Today however, as a result of steady improvements to the organization of the penal system, such cases are very rare, if not practically non-existent” (no. 56).

In modern industrialized states, killing convicted murderers adds nothing to anyone’s safety. It is an excess. It cannot be justified except in the most extraordinary conditions. Moreover, for John Paul II, the punishment of any crime should not only seek to redress wrong and protect society. It should also encourage the possibility of repentance, restitution and rehabilitation on the part of the criminal. Execution removes that hope.


## LEADERSHIP POSITIONS AVAILABLE

## Sponsor Couple Program for Christian Marriage Preparation

Welcome to an enriching ministry done from the comfort of your home:

The Sponsor Couple Mentoring program offers you an opportunity to share your faith and marital experiences with engaged couples preparing for marriage at Seton Parish.

*The program was started by Fr. Rob Ruhnke in Houston Texas in 1981 and has been used as an alternative to other pre-Cana programs offered by the Dioceses. Since Seton adopted the program in 1990, over 300 engaged couples have benefited from mentoring by the sponsoring couples. The success of the program is the one-to-one ratio of married couple to engaged couple and the ability to cater to the needs of each individual couple.*

*Fr. Ruhnke has authored an instructional manual for sponsor couples and a dialog packet to share with the engaged couple during the program. Both publications are very well written and easy to follow.*

The engaged couple meets at the sponsor couples home for five sessions that last about two hours each, and the sessions are scheduled about one week apart. As you go through the dialog packet during each session, you not only mentor the engaged couple during their preparation, but also have the opportunity to enrich your own marriage through sharing.

We currently have sixteen sponsor couples in our program and would like to expand the number to at least twenty-five. We understand busy schedules limits the time people have available, so we try very hard to schedule each sponsor couple no more than twice a year.

We believe every married couple has much to share with others preparing for marriage and can enlighten their own marriage through this sharing. Many sponsor couples have also developed lasting friendships with the engaged couples. Please give this ministry some prayerful thought.

# Business Meeting Minutes

## Minutes for February 9th, 2006

The meeting officially opened at 7:40 pm. by the Grand Knight Greg Lowe. Prior to the opening a check was presented to the Fairfield County Special Olympics for \$XXXX from last years measure up campaign. The representatives from the Special Olympics offered their thanks. The money will be going to their new fitness and youth program, at the Central High School Gym. This program will help to instill healthy lifestyle ideas in the kids, including everything from exercise to diet. It will start as a once a week program and will expand from there.

**Reading of the Minutes:** A motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes and accept them as published. The motion was seconded, and approved by the council.

**Chaplain's Report:** Father expressed that the most important project we are working on in the parish right now is the work of the Vision planning committee. This committee is made up of 10 members of parish finance council, pastoral council members as well as at large members of the parish. The Committee is under the direction for Helmut Naunheimer, the development director for Bishop Hartley High school. This is phase one of aligning all aspects of the parish under a common vision. The first phase is an interview process, starting with the members of the committee and branching out to a sampling of all members both active and inactive. We are growing and continue to grow so we will have to continue to plan for that as we go forward.

**Admissions:** We had no new members to discuss. We did have one transfer that was submitted to the officers last weekend.

**Grand Knights Report:** We received four activity reports back from supreme and were given full credit for each. As of Jan 1 2006 we are now #2 but we remain #1 in our division. We have a deficiency in our insurance of 5. Our goal is 7 and we only have 2. The Grand Knight has left a message with Mark Mandel, our agent, in an attempt to get assistance in achieving our goals. Mark has indicated that he does have several programs that may be of help to us. If any Knights have insurance needs please be sure to get in contact with Mark so he may assist you.

A correction needed to be made to the Grand Knights report in the newsletter. In the Grand Knights article he indicated that the Charity Raffle kickoff would be on Feb. 19<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 in the PAC. In actuality the kickoff will be on the 19<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 in Herrmann Hall. Brother Bud has volunteered to chair the campaign, and Pat Cleary will be providing coffee and snacks for the event.

March 3<sup>rd</sup> is the Lenten Fish fry kick off. John, Tom, or Bob will be calling Knights seeking volunteers. They are also still looking to establish a permanent clean up crew for the event. The first Fish fry occurs the same weekend as the Golf outing so assistance on that night will be even more critical.

We are attempting to put together a calendar and budget for next year. We currently have a rough draft of both that we will publish in the next newsletter so everyone may review it. Our year end

audit was completed.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> degree will be on the 26<sup>th</sup> at Our Lady of Perpetual Help. We will be carpooling down and the group will leave from the parking lot at 11:00.

The council was presented with a request from the baseball coach of Fisher Catholic High School. They are in dire need of equipment for their athletic program. During the state championship last year they had to borrow batting helmets because the ones they had did not meet standards. We have decided to donate \$500.00 to them. Joe Rossi also invited the coach to contact his son-in-law who may be able to provide them equipment at lower prices. The team will be placing our council logo on their outfield fence in appreciation.

We donated \$20.00 to the District Deputy for a state ad.

We received a request from Nancy Cornell to donate to the Ohio Diabetes association Swim for Diabetes fund raiser. The floor was opened for discussion on how much to contribute and it was determined after discussion that we would contribute \$200.00.

There was a request for a donation to aid in the purchase of a memorial plaque for the new 4<sup>th</sup> degree Assembly 2900 here at Seton Parish. The final decision on what type of monument will be constructed has yet to be voted on and decided by the Assembly. A motion was made and seconded to donate \$XXX to the assembly for the purchase of a plaque. After discussion the motion was modified to \$XXX. Since this is below the discretionary limit of \$XXX the Grand Knight approved the \$XXX.

For the pancake breakfast last weekend we served over 380 breakfasts, cleared \$XXXX and grossed \$XXXX. This was one our more successful breakfasts. The Squires once again assisted at the breakfast and it was noted that a portion of the proceeds from our breakfasts would go to the Squires.

Dave McAllister reported on the free throw contest. The contest was on Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup> we had 18 participants and had 8 or 9 Knights helping out. We will also be hosting the district free throw competition on the Sat. the 25<sup>th</sup> of Feb. at 9:00 am. Wayne is working to get a couple of portable baskets in the PAC. Five councils will be participating this year since we are now in district 30 instead of 39.

At the officers meeting it was noted that the cost of parking for the Christmas Mass was much higher that the estimate we were given. We are currently investigating this discrepancy and we will refrain from paying the bill until this issue is resolved.

Thanks to all who worked at the Monte Carlo. It was a great success with the exception being that we ran out of beer. We raised \$XXXX. A second Monte Carlo is planned for May pending some new discussion. We will be having a dealing school in April to increase the number of Poker Dealers we have. It was also noted that for the calendar next year we should once again make sure we are not competing against any football games.

We are in the process of evaluating our ability to continue having Monte Carlo nights. We have recently been informed that we are not in compliance with the Ohio Revised Code. Currently we are not a non-profit organization in the eyes of the IRS. Even if we do achieve that status we cannot conduct them unless we have a

facility we have owned for at least a year or a facility we rent from a veterans organization or a similar tax exempt organization. The first hurdle will be to determine if we can become eligible as a 501C3 organization. If we cannot we have additional options. We can form a true non-profit organization that is a subsidiary of this council, and then lease the PAC for the Monte Carlo Nights. If we do this all proceeds would have to go to charity right away. The Monte Carlo nights currently cost a little over \$XXX to put on. We also have a limit of only 2 events per year so this too may revise our plans for the May Monte Carlo. We will continue to review the information we have to determine if we will be able to continue the Monte Carlo nights.


