Business Meeting Minutes 13 May 2009

Meeting opened at: 7:32 pm

Roll of Officers: Chaplain, Grand Knight, Treasurer, 2 Year Trustee - Excused

Reading of the Minutes: Gene Ebert moved that the minutes be accepted as published. Jesus Garcia seconded, motion passed.

Chaplain's Report: (Fr. Jim or Deacon Hector) Hector read an article about a town in Croatia with 0% divorce rate. He talked about the three types of love: Eros, Phileo, and Agape.

Report on Admissions: (Mark Knight or any other Brother Knights with a Form 100) Mark has five form 100's for: Adam Wharton, brothers Kevin and Mark Wilson, Mark Newhouse, and Doug Foster. Jesus Garcia moved that the applications be accepted. Frank Hare seconded and the motion passed.

Trustee's Report: (Jesse Garcia, Dick Petersen, Mike Croyle) No report.

Chancellor's Report: (Harry Clyburn) - Used the Lecturer's time to speak on Men's Faith Groups.

Advocate's Report: (Gene Ebert) We will have elections for the next fraternal year later tonight.

Report of Service Committees/Programs:

Membership: (Mark Knight) We will host a 1st degree on May 27 and have 5 candidates expected to attend from our Council. There will be another June 4 at Resurrection parish.

Program Director: (Frank Hare) No report, but Wayne stated that we have maxed out our points at 1500 and met our membership goal for Star Council.

Church Director: (Ray Creamer) Ray reported that he is having a lot of trouble getting Knights to sign up for our adoration hour and that even when they sign up they often don't show in spite of reminder phone calls. He also expressed frustration with leaving phone messages that are never returned.

Squires: (Steve Malott) Our Squires Circle will be sending 4 delegates to the State Squires Convention with 6 to 7 total Squires from our Circle attending.

Respect Life: (Edd Chinnock) This Saturday morning we will pot flowers at the Seton picnic shelter, then we will take them to

Pickerington Nursing Home and give a flower to each resident to brighten their room. The Respect Life committee will then take a break for the summer.

Blue Coat Dinner: (Ron Blymyer) It is scheduled for Friday, June 26th. Ron is getting things together, but needs someone to volunteer to be MC for the evening.

Report of Standing Committees:

We will ask preschool representatives to attend our next meeting or at least have answers to our questions by then.

On behalf of the Seton Adult Ringers, Seton Youth Ringers and Seton Youth Beginner Ringers, we wish to express our thanks for your generosity in helping us obtain the remaining three hand bells that bring our set from a 3-octave (37 bell) to a 4-octave (49 bell) instrument. For music that is written for 4-octaves, the addition of these bells will provide a broader and richer sound as we play God's music.

This gives us the opportunity to now use the other nine bells already purchased for this additional octave (some by donations of choir members and parishioners) and to perhaps expand our choirs by up to three more ringers, Adults and Youth, to play these bells.

In the future, we hope to be able to also complete our hand chimes which are currently only 2-octaves, to 4-octaves. Hand chimes are a complimentary instrument played along with the bells by the same ringers.

When this is accomplished, our hand bell/hand chime instruments will be completed.

Respect Life: Post-Abortion Healing

The Bethesda Healing Ministry is a Catholic Christian ministry of hospitality and healing. Through a community of love and acceptance all men and women wounded by abortion are invited to share a rich healing journey through fellowship, prayer and the Sacraments.

Fr. Joseph Klee is the chaplain for Bethesda. Fr. Klee has accompanied us on several of our bus trips to the March for Life in Washington, DC. This past January he could not go with us on the bus due to his duties at his parish in the Portsmouth area, but he drove separately and stayed with us at our hotel.

In the Spring 2009 issue of Bethesda News, Fr. Klee wrote this excellent article for his Chaplain's Corner column:

How can anything good come of this?

Although Bethesda per se does not take part in prolife activities, being that our mission is treating the aftereffects of abortion, many in our organization nevertheless do strive as well to prevent people from becoming new victims of the abortion holocaust. Given this orientation, and not mincing words, any and all proponents of God's paramount gift of life were truly dealt the most serious threat to life since Roe v. Wade itself with this past November's election. Not content to merely continue with the present level of the killing of the innocents, this administration has already committed to increasing the bloodbath by expanding the availability of abortion, through the implementation of policies and through the appointment of personnel to achieve this end. In short, many more women-mothers will thus consequently be deceived into swallowing the poison pill of abortion, with emotional and spiritual devastation to follow.

However, in a brief conversation I was blessed to have with a prominent figure in the Pro-life Movement (shortly before the "Vigil for Life" Mass in Washington, DC this past January,) we heartily agreed that this apparent curse may very well be part of God's plan. We both speculated that this administration's nefarious policies hopefully will result in the reawakening of a strong grassroots reaction, which we pray will lead to an eventual restoration of life-protecting measures presently being stripped away. At this point for the benefit of the mothers, fathers, and babies, this is our prayer.

In that regard *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* points out a Divine mystery that is the source of our hope: "... *God in his almighty providence can bring a good from the consequences of an evil, even a moral evil, caused by his creatures ... From the greatest moral evil ever committed - the rejection and murder of God's only Son, caused by the sins of all men - God, by his grace ... brought the greatest of goods: the glorification of Christ and our redemption.*" (CCC 312)
