

Squires: Steve stated the Squires are having a pancake breakfast this Sunday. They need help to get set up done and working the kitchen. The squires cleaned up their rosters and are down to 12 Active members. The goal for the breakfast is 300 meals. Money goes to the Danville retreat (October 26th-27th) and the Convention. Support our future Knights by helping out even if it is for 1 hour. Softball game is on hold. Squire Mike Faga is undergoing major surgery in October, so we will keep him in our prayers.

Respect Life: Don't forget the Life Chain that was mentioned earlier. Edd has been going to the Statehouse to visit Voinovich and Austria's offices to discuss the health care bills that allow abortions to be paid with taxpayer money. He will be going to Sherrod Brown's office soon. March for Life - Our Council will sponsor the bus. DC trip is on January 21st and 22nd. Bus holds 55 people. \$180.00 per person to go. Need about 40 to fill the bus. December 15th the last day to get your money in. 15 members of the Youth Group plan to go and spend the night at the Basilica which will cut down their hotel costs. 40 days of Life starts on September 23rd- November 1st. People go in front of Abortion Clinics and pray on the sidewalk. Very powerful, and Edd recommends that everyone go if they can. They go to the one on Cleveland Avenue, and are going to go on October 3rd. PDHC banquet at Villa Milano and Lancaster is coming up, and contact Edd if you want to go.

37th Annual March for Life

The Knights of Columbus are sponsoring a two day, one night bus trip to Washington, D.C. leaving Thursday, January 21st and returning in early Saturday morning hours of January 23rd.

Insurance Corner - October

The Knights of Columbus policy on replacing existing life insurance is as follows: *“The Order does not condone the practice of soliciting replacement insurance or using cash values or dividends of existing policies to finance new business. In most cases, replacement is not to the policyholder’s advantage.”*

The reasons for this are many. First, premiums usually increase on a new policy because it is issued at an older age. The older you are, the more expensive life insurance is.

Many times, options available under the older policy are lost and sometimes not offered under the new policy. In addition, a new “incontestability” period begins with the new contract. The Order, for example, maintains the right to contest a claim up to two years from the issue date of the policy. A new policy brings with it a new issue date, and a new “incontestability” period.

You purchased the life insurance you have for a reason - probably a very good reason. It is a good idea to hold onto that coverage. That doesn’t mean you have all the coverage you need or will ever need.

Pelotonia Ride for Cancer

Good day fellow Knights! John Sambuco, Father Klima and I would like to thank the Knights of Columbus for their support in our quest to aid the Pelotonia. All donations, some \$4,000,000, went directly to the cancer research performed at The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center - James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute. There were 2,265 riders committed to raise donations to help find a cure for cancer.

Those of you who are not familiar with John, he is an avid cyclist. John was riding for his cousin David Sambuco (Died in 1998 from squamous cell cancer); his mother Mary (Renal cell cancer and breast cancer) who continues to fight cancer; and friends. John rode an incredible 100 miles including the massive hill near Athens. When you see him, ask him about his experience.

As for myself, I could only muster up enough energy to finish the 50 miles into Amanda (Do not tell my doctors as they reluctantly agreed to 25 miles). I was diagnosis two years ago with stage IV non-smoker lung cancer, which had spread to my brain and bones. My mother (1995); grandfather (1995); and my mother sister (2009) have all succumbed to cancer. My cousin is a survivor of lymphoma cancer. Going the extra miles help me still feel alive, which I believe is necessary to survive.

Being semi-retired as a Special Agent with the Department of the Treasury, I have an opportunity to give back to those who have

support me in my fight. Words of encouragement can be the best healer. My background as a CPA is in tax, accounting and individual/small business consulting as well as law enforcement. There are those that are less fortunate and can not afford to get help. I want to help, so if you need help or know somebody who does, please talk to me.

Chancellor's Spot:

The **Seven Deadly Sins**, also known as the **Capital Vices** or **Cardinal Sins**, is a classification of the most offensive vices which have been used since early Christian times to educate and instruct followers concerning immoral fallen man's tendency to sin. It consists of the following: Lust, Gluttony, Greed, Pride, Wrath, Envy and Sloth.

The Catholic Church divides sin into two principal categories: Venial Sins, which are relatively minor, and can be forgiven through any "Sacramentals" i.e. Rosary, etc or the "Sacraments" of the church, and the more severe "Capital" or Mortal Sins. Mortal sins destroy the life of grace, and create the threat of eternal damnation unless either absolved through the sacrament of Confession, or forgiven through perfect contrition on the part of the penitent.

In the Catechism, the **Seven Virtues** refers to one of two lists of virtues, most commonly referring to the 4 Cardinal Virtues of: Prudence, Justice, Temperance (Restraint) and Fortitude (Courage) and the 3 Theological

Virtues of: Faith, Hope and Love (or Charity). These were adopted by the Church Fathers from virtue as defined by the Greek philosophers Plato and Aristotle.

An alternative list is the **Seven Heavenly Virtues**, opposed to the **Seven Deadly Sins**, consist of:

Virtue: Chastity
Implication: Purity
Vice (Sin): Lust

Virtue in Action: Abstaining from inappropriate sexual conduct according to one's state in life. Embracing of moral wholesomeness and achieving purity of thought through education and prayer.

Virtue: Temperance
Implication: Self-Control
Vice (Sin): Gluttony

Virtue in Action: Constant mindfulness of others and one's surroundings; practicing self-control, abstention, and moderation.

Virtue: Charity
Implication: Generosity
Vice (Sin): Greed

Virtue in Action: Willingness to give in thought and action.

Virtue: Diligence
Implication: Persistence, Effort
Vice (Sin): Acedia, Sloth

Virtue in Action: A zealous and careful nature in one's actions and work. Decisive work ethic. Budgeting one's time; monitoring one's own activities to guard against laziness.

Virtue: Patience
Implication: Peace
Vice (Sin): Wrath, Anger

Virtue in Action: Forbearance and endurance through moderation. Resolving conflicts peacefully, as opposed to resorting to violence. The ability to forgive; to show mercy to sinners.

Virtue: Kindness
Implication: Consideration
Vice (Sin): Envy, Selfishness

Virtue in Action: Charity, compassion, friendship and empathy without prejudice and for its own sake.

Virtue: Humility
Implication: Modesty
Vice (Sin): Pride

Virtue in Action: Modest behavior, selflessness, and the giving of respect. Giving credit where credit is due; not unfairly glorifying one's own self.

The Eighth Virtue

Virtue: Justice
Implication: Fairness
Vice (Sin): Corruption

Virtue in Action: Honesty and the giving of righteousness. Being fair or telling the truth. Doing what is right and not what is wrong. It is the light of truth that conquers the dark of the wrong.

Ask God to strengthen and bless these virtues in your life, because in their expression you will be able to see him transform lives around you and be glorified. You can be a great testimony to God's presence and work in an individual. Pray, ask, receive the Sacraments, say a Rosary – take the first step or another step on your road to Holiness – that's what God is calling us to do!





Respect Life: Health Care Reform

In last month's article I listed five major points that must be addressed in any new health care reform bill in order for it to be acceptable to those who respect life:

1. **Abortion coverage must be specifically excluded from any government plan or the courts WILL require it.**
2. **Do not mandate "end of life" counseling for elderly of terminally patients.**
3. **Do not ration health care for the elderly or terminally ill.**
4. **Insure that conscience protections for doctors, nurses, and hospitals remain in place.**
5. **Do not allow Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers to operate clinics in or near public schools.**

I would be remiss if I did not thank Tim Pione for researching these points. Most of the facts and figures I cited last month came from Tim's research, but I forgot to credit him in that article.

Health care reform bills are still being considered by both the Senate and the House, and so far none of these bills have addressed the above issues. In fact, every attempt to amend a bill with these provisions has been voted down. Our work is not done: we MUST contact our Congressional representatives as soon as possible and urge them to support these changes.

In order to do just that, I, along with several members of the Seton Respect Life Committee, other Seton parishioners and a member of Pope John XXIII parish met with staffers from Senator Voinovich's and Representative Steve Austria's offices. We gave them a handout prepared by Tim Pione listing the points I gave in last month's article along with the facts and figures to support them. Both offices were very receptive, but Steve Austria's representative indicated that he is completely in agreement with our points. Senator Voinovich's representative was non-committal, but told us Senator Voinovich was in general agreement. We had good discussions with both offices and they told us that talking directly with them has a greater impact on the Senator and Representative than other forms of contact. They told us that after personal meetings, phone calls have the most impact, followed by personal letters, with form letters and email having the least effect, though large numbers of the latter do impress our representatives.

Accordingly, we are in the process of scheduling a similar meeting with Senator Sherrod Brown. Senator Brown has been a strong supporter of the Obama Health Care Reform bill, so his staffers are not likely to be quite as accepting of our points. Our hope is to change his mind through personal contact and large numbers of his constituents telling him how they feel.

Regardless of what you think of the overall bill and the need for health care reform, it is urgent that every Knight call or write ALL THREE of your representatives in Congress and ask them to include language in the final bill to support these critical Respect Life issues.


