Our Rosary will continue to be prayed before our First Saturday Status Update Meeting.

Excused members were Chaplain Fr. Klima, Deputy Grand Knight Glenn Williams, Advocate Mike Sillings, Warden Ron Blymire, Outer Guard John McFaul and Trustee 3 Year Tim Bowie.

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Edd Chinnock, seconded by Wayne Patterson, voted on and passed.

Chaplain's Report: No report

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. George Schneider then began with a list of important items.

Discussion was raised on having a Knights Appreciation Dinner for ourselves to honor our activities and involvement for the year. It was decided against in favor of a dinner or luncheon to perhaps follow the Memorial Service celebration next year.

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Bog Glavan sat in for Brother Mark Borys (who is recovering from surgery) and reported on all bills and income for the month. These bills were motioned to be sent to the trustees for signing and payment. This was accomplished in a timely manner.

A seminarian from Texas who is at the Josephinum shared this with me recently. Please feel free to share it with other adorers.

Christopher, who is now in his mid 20's, was 16 when his parish started Perpetual Adoration. Someone mentioned to him that he should sign up for an hour. He did, taking the 11 pm to midnight Sunday night hour.

After a few weeks he wondered what he'd committed to. After a few months he found out. The way he put it:

"that time of night was so QUIET! I had never, ever been so quiet. It was so quiet that I began to listen to Gods voice. God led me to consider devoting my life to Him as His priest. That was a lot different than my plan, which was to go to Vanderbilt, meet a cute Southern belle, become an architect, in that order. God did have a whole other plan for my life, and I am fulfilling that partly because of Perpetual Adoration."

What a beautiful testimony.

Christopher approached me when he found out I was a Pastoral Provision candidate for ordination as his pastor had been. Many of the young men and women of the Blessed John Paul II generation who are pursuing ordination or the consecrated religious life have been deeply touched by their experience in Adoration. Gradually, one soul at a time, it is having its impact.

40th Annual March for Life – 2013 - Trip Information (Save)

Departure Information:

We shall depart from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, 600 Hill Rd., Pickerington, Ohio 43147 on chartered bus at 6:30am on Thursday, January 24th. **PLEASE ARRIVE NO LATER THAN 6:00AM.**

Directions to Seton from 70 West from Columbus:

Travel on I-70 East towards Wheeling. Take Exit 112A towards Pickerington. Travel 2.9 miles through Pickerington. Seton Parish is on the left.

Stops on the trip:

We will make lunch and restroom stops on the trip out and dinner and restroom stops on the trip back. These will be cafeteria style food stops. You need to bring money for food or snacks purchased at these stops.

Arrival Info (Jan. 24):

We arrive at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, 400 Michigan Ave. Washington, D.C. (202-526-8300) at ~4:00pm. The Mass for Life begins at 6:30pm. You can eat and tour the basilica between 4:00 and 6:30pm. Dinner is on your own.

After Mass:

We will board our bus and proceed to our hotel `begin_of_the_skype_highlightingend_of_the_skype_highlighting` for check-in, late snacks, and bed time. We are staying at the Embassy Suites Washington, 1250 22nd St NW, Washington, DC 20037, 202-857-3388.

Day Two Events (Jan. 25)

After our breakfast at the hotel (included), we will leave at 8:00am to attend the Youth Rally and 10:00am Mass. At 11:30am we proceed to the Mall by the Smithsonian for the 12:00 noon rally. The March immediately follows, ending up at the Supreme Court Building. If time permits, we may attend Congressional open houses or events. We will board our bus at Union Station and depart Washington, D.C. for home at ~6:00pm. Following a stop for dinner along the way, we shall arrive back at Seton Parish at ~2:00am.

Items to bring or things to remember:

- Cash for meals, snacks, and souvenirs.
- Blankets and pillows for the trip.
- Non-perishable snacks and drinks.
- Umbrellas
- Mittens, hats, scarves, old shoes or boots, and dry socks for after the March.
- Dress in layers!
- Backpack for use during the March
- Pro-Life signs, banners, pennants, or items to display if you wish.
- Any videos on the bus will be provided by the Committee.
- Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on the bus or in the presence of the youth.**
