Business Meeting Notes - September 11, 2019

Prior to the meeting, Anna Tobin, Executive Director of Meals on Wheels for Fairfield County handed out their brochure and spoke about their services. They provide a nutritious meal to seniors, age 60 and over, 900 meals a day, serve 2,400 individual, offer nutrition counseling, assessments, minor home repairs, caregiving support, and in-home services. They have volunteer opportunities to pack meals, deliver meals, check their web site...www.mowfc.org. Volunteers can do 1 day a week, or even 1½ hours a week as a couple or as a group. Mark Tomson, a volunteer shared his story on delivering meals.

Thom Laughery presented a \$XXX donation check from the Measure Up Campaign to Temple Anne Custer-Gagni, Dir. of Community, for Fairfield County Development Disabilities, that serve 1,254 individuals and families from birth to age 90. They currently have 55 in their Forrest Road School for those with disabilities.

Grand Knight Frank Hare called the official meeting to order at 7:09 pm and introduced Bill Weber who is a transfer to our Council, member since 1954.

Bill Merriman, District Deputy, conducted the Installation of Officers for FY 2019/2020.

Culture of Life: Pregnancy from Rape

Supporting Life From Conception Until Natural Death

A rape victim becomes pregnant - what situation could be more emotionally charged than that?

Even among those who are pro-life, some individuals are tempted to condone aborting children conceived from rape out of a natural empathy for the rape victim. Abortion advocates love this situation, using it constantly to show the "need" for abortion to be legal. Because abortion is already legal for any reason, their real purpose is to marginalize those who are pro-life by painting them as insensitive and rigid.

Rape is not a sex crime - it is a crime of violence, of power and control. Stranger rape is estimated to be between 8 and 20 percent of all rapes. The vast majority of rape is committed by someone the victim knows - husbands, boyfriends, family members, and acquaintances. The vast majority of victims were related to or in a relationship with their attacker.

The number of pregnancies resulting from rape is frequently overstated. Relatively few rapes result in pregnancy because a single act of unprotected sexual intercourse only results in pregnancy 2 to 4 percent of the time, 10.9 percent of women are infertile, and more than 41 percent are using contraception. Only one percent of women report rape as a reason for abortion and less than one-half of one percent report it as the main reason.

Abortion advocates perpetuate the myth that pregnant rape victims generally desire abortion, and this makes it difficult for women to choose the life-giving alternative for their child. We must not forget that pregnant rape victims are not suddenly separated from the person they were before the rape. They bring to this difficult journey their beliefs, their sense of right and wrong, and everything else that they were.

The abortion rate among rape victims (50 percent) is not substantially higher than among all women who report an "unintended pregnancy" (40 percent). A study of 164 such women found that the majority of those who had abortions regretted having done so and said the abortion caused them additional problems. Among those who delivered a child conceived by rape, satisfaction was higher, and none stated any regret for having given birth.

Abortion, then, is not an inevitable choice. The loving support of family, friends, and counselors can make a huge difference.
