The Grand Knight closed the meeting at 8:18 pm and asked that the Holy Father be kept in prayers. The next meeting will be held on July 27th.

Business Planning Meeting - July 27, 2021

Grand Knight Thom Laughery called the meeting to order at 6:40 pm with prayer.

Grand Knight's Report: GK Thom Laughery stated we had several motions to discuss for the next Membership meeting on Weds., 8/4/21, at 7 pm. Officer installation will occur at the September meeting. With the new CDC recommendations, he has mask available. He along with Francis Wilamosky and Bob Coholich went to the Ohio Road Show which provided a Covid guideline book; free membership for new members will continue until 12/31/21; for the 4 programs - 1 is mandatory and 4 are elective; per diem has been raised from \$45 per day to \$55 and milage reimbursement increased from \$.45 to \$.55 per mile; all suspensions have to be completed by 10/1/21. Our Council received two plagues at the Ohio Road Show, a Bronze Award for obtaining new members and the second plaque for S.O.S (Support Our Seminarians) for our Council's \$1,000 donation.

Treasurer's Report: Dan Murphy sent out the numbers, any questions let him know. The FY 2021/2022 budget will be voted upon at next week's meeting. The \$1,752.07 from the Squires account was placed in the Capital Benefit & Reserve account and will continue to be held there for some time. Taxes and the audit are both done.

Membership: Tim Lee reported that Dustin Goodchild, Zack's brother, has completed his application on line. Father Ondrey plans on becoming a Knight.

Deputy Grand Knight: Francis Wilamosky reported that Ohio Road Show was well attended with 120 guys; Vocational Director stated that \$32,642 was donated from the District for Seminarians; new slogan for this year is "Lord I Am Your Servant"; trying to pump up membership drives; 2021 Football Raffle - \$20 per ticket will be for 10 weeks starting in October - rebate back to Council could be \$5.50 to \$9.00; recent email pertaining to Right to Life encourages Knights to write a letter to your Senator opposing using tax payer funds for abortions; and the Generations Religious Gifts store has a school supplies campaign called "Tools for Catholic Schools".

Report on Programs and Committees

Right to Life: Mike Gohr plans on publishing articles in the newsletter that will include human trafficking which is a big problem in Ohio.

Family Director: Chuck Slaby mentioned that the next big event will be the Fall Family Festival on 10/23/21, talked to Father Leo who mentioned that his last parish did a Halloween trunk and treat, seeking recommendations.

New Business:

MOTION: Gene Ebert made a motion to publish in the next newsletter: To send \$XXX to St. Paul Outreach with \$XXX coming from the Community Budget and \$XXX coming from the Youth Budget, plan to discuss and vote on it at the 8/4/21 membership meeting.

MOTION: Dan M. Murphy made a motion to provide \$XXX to the Seton School Supply Drive that supports 9 schools with a goal of providing 30 boxes per school out of the Community budget, 2nd by Rick Schlachter, discussion and voting will occur at the 8/4/21 membership meeting.

Dan M. Murphy read a letter from Barb Serrano, Youth Minister, pertaining to the SPY program at Seton in which she thanked our Council for supporting our Youth with the Gospel Road dinner, and asking for our prayers for our Youth as they are called to be disciples of Christ. July 31st there will be a Disciple Retreat in conjunction with St. Pius X to bring families back into church, cost is \$XXX. They are planning to have the Shoe Drive again this fall and the Portsmouth Food Drive, for the National Youth Conference planning to have 2 buses from the diocese, cost is \$XXX per person, and then in January is the March for Life in Washington DC.

MOTION: Dan M. Murphy made a motion to donate \$XXX from the Community budget to the Seton SPY program to sponsor two students to attend the 7/31/21 Disciple Retreat, 2nd by Frank Hare, discussion and voting will occur at the 8/4/21 membership meeting.

MOTION: Dan Murphy on behalf of Wayne Patterson made a motion to donate \$XXX from the Church budget for our annual contribution for the Diocese Sunday morning TV Mass, 2nd by Mike S illings, discussion and voting will occur at the 8/4/21 membership meeting.

Reminder, the Seton Parish Festival is coming up in August, all areas need volunteers to help. 13 of the programs are chaired by a Knight and the overall chairman, Jason Heitmeyer is also a Knight. GK Thom Laughery will need 70 people to help him with Food, Jay Oconer will need help setting up on 8/11 and 8/12 at 6 pm, meet at the shelter house, Mike Gohr will need help with games for the kids.

Mike Gohr reminded that the parish program, "That Man is You", is meeting Saturday morning at 7:30 am in the shelter house and then the fall session will start on 9/11/21 in Herman Hall, consider participating in this men's program.

Grand Knight Thom Laughery officially closed the meeting at 7:28 pm with prayer. Membership Meeting is scheduled for August 4th at 7 pm, come early as the rosary will be prayed at 6:30 pm.
