Grand Knight's Report: GK Thom Laughery reported that we will be implementing new guidelines for membership meetings beginning in February, he would like Officers and Program Directors to attend the "New Knights of Columbus Meetings Format" webinar on Sat., 1/16/20 from 10 am to 11 am, there are 40 pages of guideline changes. Received thank you notes from the seminarians for the Council's Christmas card/donations and from the Seton parish staff for the gift basket. Father Jim has approved take out only Fish Fries for Lent starting 2/19/21, will need new inventory and volunteers to move equipment. Seton is planning a virtual presentation for "The Men's Conference" on 2/27/21 from 9 am to noon. The Knights will be

having the Super Cash Bonanza raffle again, will pick up tickets on 2/21/21, Dan M. Murphy volunteered to Chair it again this year, thanks Dan. Free membership dues for new members have been extended until 6/30/21. Liz Christy approached him in regards to wanting the Knights to do more with the parish, partnering with them on more events/projects.

Treasurer Report: Dan Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers and program chairs, let him know if there are any questions or if anyone wants the numbers, all entries have been properly reconciled.

Financial Secretary Report: Frank Hare stated that 80 members are left to pay their 2021 dues, plans to send out a 2nd notice on Sunday, 1/17/21. Income for the month included dues, Gimme 5. Expenses were for benevolent, credit card fees, supplies. Chancellors Report: Dick Petersen thanked those for their Christmas support for our seminarians Zack Goodchild, John Paul and Michael Hammerle along with Emmanuel Ingabire who will be going back to his home country in May. Keep up your prayers for them.

Report on Programs and Committees

Membership Director: Tim Lee reported we have 259 members, up two for the year. Use code MCGIVNEY2020 for free online membership until 6/30/21 for applicants.

Program Director: Bob Coholich, no report.

Benevolent: Mike Croyle, no report. **Church Director:** Absent, no report.

Community Director: Dan M. Murphy, the St. Vincent de Paul truck will be at Seton on 1/23 and 1/24/21.

Life & Council Director: Francis Wilamosky mentioned that St. Vincent de Paul needs winter clothing, plans to publish in the bulletin and will need some volunteers to help that weekend. For the virtual "Men's Conference" on 2/27/21, Seton will allow up to 100 attendees, reservations needed, \$10 cover charge, no food or

beverages will be served. Plans to work with Liz Christy to get the Knights more visible on the Parish web site and getting the Knights to partner with the Parish on church events and helping to get parishioners back. 400 people have signed up for the Bible Study with Father Mike Schmidt.

Family Director: Chuck Slaby stated that there were 10 kids that submitted posters for "Keep Christ in Christmas" virtual poster contest, had 3 winners that each received a \$25 gift card. Coming up is the "Concertation to the Holy Family" in Lent, will work with Liz Christy on this and several other programs.

Youth Director: Absent, no report.

Squires Report: Absent, no report.

Right to Life Director: Mike Gohr reported that January is the 48th anniversary of Roe v. Wade decision that caused over 60 million babies to never be born. The Respect Life Mass will be 1/22/21 at 10:30 am at St. Joseph Cathedral with Bishop Brennan as the celebrant, following from noon to 1 pm will be the Roe Remembrance held outside on the Ohio Statehouse lawn. 9 Days for Life, 1/21-29/21, is a multi-faceted novena for the respect and protection of human life. The National Prayer Vigil for Life will be livestreamed on 1/28-29/21 and the Youth Rally and Mass for Life on 1/29/21 at 8:30 am and the March for Life will be livestreamed on 1/29/22 from noon to 1:15 pm. Continue to pray for babies and for the women that are making their decision.

Blue Coat Dinner: Dick Petersen stated the cost for the awards are \$75 each and would suggest sending each winner a gift card since we will not be holding a dinner in April for each Eagle Award winner at the Violet Township Fire Dept., Pickerington Police Dept. and Fairfield County Sheriff Dept. and this year an extra award for Sheriff Dave Phalen who just retired. Hopes to have a Estate Planning meeting in the future. Will have an answer on the need for Officers/Directors insurance at our next Planning Meeting on 2/2/21. Right to Life: Teaching Hate

Supporting Life From Conception Until Natural Death

On January 22, 2021, Vicki and I attended Bishop Brennan's Respect Life Mass at St. Joseph Cathedral in downtown Columbus. This is an annual event to mark the anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court Roe v Wade decision that legalized abortion in the United States for any reason through all nine months of pregnancy. 2021 is the 48th anniversary of this misbegotten decision.

In the middle of Bishop Brennan's homily, about 8 pro-abortion activists burst into the cathedral screaming obscenities and pro-abortion slogans, dropping the F-bomb, and carrying pro-abortion signs. They scattered through the cathedral down the main aisle and both side aisles. Bishop Brennan stopped his homily and the congregation sat quietly while a security guard and cathedral officials forced the activists out of the church. One of the slogans they repeatedly screamed was "this church teaches hate". Ironically, their actions did more to teach hate than anything, while the church teaches us to love, even those who oppose us.

The pro-abortionists, now about a dozen of them, gathered on the sidewalk in front of St. Joseph's to scream as the congregation left Mass. I found out later that this same group then went to the statehouse grounds where they tried to disrupt the Greater Columbus Right to Life Roe Remembrance rally. The rally went on in spite of the obnoxious and hateful actions of the abortion advocates.

Contrary to what the pro-abortion people said, the pro-life community actually preaches love and prayerful conversion of hearts and minds. The antics of the abortion advocates are the opposite of the peaceful praying outside of abortion mills, where if we even set foot on their property they call the police and try to have the pro-Life people arrested. In spite of their actions, not a single pro-abortion person was arrested.

This event shows how deeply the pro-abortion side hates and fears the pro-life movement, which means our prayers and presence at the abortion mills are working. Please continue to pray for an end to abortion and come to the clinics whenever you can, but especially during 40 Days for Life and other organized prayer gatherings.

In closing, please pray the following prayer for life from the USCCB Secretariat for Pro-Life Activities:

Father and maker of all,
you adorn all creation
with splendor and beauty,
and fashion human lives
in your image and likeness.
Awaken in every heart
reverence for the work of your hands,
and renew among your people
a readiness to nurture and sustain
your precious gift of life.

Grant this through our Lord
Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in
the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God forever and ever.
Amen.
