Membership Meeting Notes - September 8 2021

Grand Knight Thom Laughery called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm with prayer.

Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain, Chancellor, Advocate and Financial Secretary, all excused. Ralph Blamer motioned to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, Wayne Patterson 2nd. Voted upon and passed.

Chaplains Report: Absent, no report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Tim Lee stated that we have two transfers joining our Council, Father Leo Connolly and Phil Siedlecki, both 4th degree. Ralph Blamer indicated that his grandson, Robert B. Cottrill Jr., a former Squire, will be applying for membership. Our Council currently has 248 members.

Grand Knight's Report: GK Thom Laughery and the Parish thanked all the Knights that worked at the Seton Festival which was one of the best ever. Tonight, we will be talking about the October membership drive, conducting a new survey, and the football frenzy raffle.

Treasurer Report: Dan Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers and program chairs, let him know if there are any questions or if anyone wants the numbers, all entries have been properly reconciled.

Financial Secretary Report: Absent, no report.

Report of the Fourth Degree: Ken Higdon, Faithful Admiral for Assembly 2900 and a Saint John XXIII Council 16561 member, asked for support for the VA Ticket Raffle as he is Chair, tickets are \$10 each, only 200 tickets, \$1,000 goes to the winner and the remaining goes to the Vets, drawing at the November meeting. Right To Life: Mike Gohr mentioned that the group is active again, recently had their first meeting of the year, he published the meeting minutes in the newsletter.

Youth: Wayne Patterson stated that the SPY Mass will be at 6 pm on Sunday, 9/12/21.

Pancake Breakfast: Karl Shuster reported that they are all set to go for the first one on 10/10/21.

Public Relations: Francis Wilamosky, let him know if you have anything for the bulletin, plans to list the upcoming events.

Lecturer Report: Bill Richards talked about 9/11 and keeping the victims and their families in our prayers. Since today is the birth of Mary, offer a rosary asking her to intercede for us that we never have another day like 9/11.

Grand Knight Thom Laughery officially closed the meeting at 8:15 pm. Invited everyone to join us for a social gathering in the PAC's kitchen. Next membership meeting is scheduled for October 13th at 7:00 pm, with the rosary being prayed at 6:30 pm

Business Planning Meeting Notes - October 6, 2021

Deputy Grand Knight Francis Wilamosky called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm with prayer.

Grand Knight's Report: DGK Francis Wilamosky stated that there was a great response this past weekend for the Membership Drive, Donut Sunday and read the email, dated 10/3/21, from Father Connolly that was sent to all members of Council 11187 expressing his appreciation to the Council for our presence at all Masses. He reported on the results of Council 11187 Survey that was to be completed by 9/30/21, received 33 responses out of 240 sent out, took 12:13 minutes to complete, responders like participating in activities, 32 out of 33 feel they are informed about upcoming events, one comment listed was ...Be more visible in the church...suggested that 1st Sunday of the Month the Knights need to be greeters and wear their Knight shirt at all masses. Would like to see each Knight sell 2 of the "Football Fund Crazr Sweepstakes" tickets, \$20 each.

Treasurer's Report: Dan Murphy sent out the numbers, any questions let him know or if you want to receive a copy. He has the Knights of Columbus sign ready to be put up, waiting for the parish to have the utility companies mark the ground before digging post holes.

Financial Secretary Report: Frank Hare reported that the Council is in good standing. He will be ordering supplies, if anyone needs any K of C forms, banners, prayer cards, etc. let him know.

Membership: Tim Lee reported that 3 new members signed up and several others are interested, currently have 258 members. Plans on having another Membership Drive during October, let him know if anyone is interested in becoming a member.

Field Agent: Mike Dippold stated that the Knights Of Columbus Midwest Region Fraternal Benefit Night virtual webinar "Financial Success Under Any Circumstances" by Van Mueller is scheduled for 10/13/21 at 7:30 pm which is the same date as the Membership Meeting, unfortunately they are not allowed to record it so if any Knight not attending the Membership Meeting is encouraged to join the webinar, must pre-register at vanmueller.com/knights-of-columbus-midwest-region.

Report on Programs and Committees

Right to Life: Mike Gohr attended the PDHC - Pregnancy Decision Health Center annual fund raiser at Villa Milano Restaurant last week, attendance was over 500 people. The organization is totally funded by private donations and celebrated their 40-year anniversary. Since the founding of the organization, numerous abortion clinics in Columbus and the country have shut down. He plans to attend a conference on the End-of-Life concerns at Resurrection Church in New Albany on 10/7/21 with Barb McMullen being the speaker. Father Leo suggested he attend to see about offering the talk to Seton parishioners with the Knights and the Respect Life committee sponsoring it. He will report back to the Knights at our next meeting. He also viewed on Fox Nation the movie "Roe vs Wade" which was very informative, a lot of information came out about the reasoning behind the Roe vs Wade decision.

Youth Director: Al Kluczynski stated that usually 70 youths go to Harlan, KY to deliver the shoes collected during the recent Shoe Drive, but not this year due to Covid. Current Youth Budget is \$1,000, at the November meeting he plans on reporting some additional fund-raising ideas. In January, need to support the Right to Life March and the Confirmation Retreat.

Community Director: Dan M. Murphy gave an update, (1) St. John's Food Drive will be the weekend of 11/6-11/7/21, joint effort with St. Vincent DePaul who will also provide the truck. Volunteers needed to man the truck before and after masses but especially to unload the truck at St. John's Church Sunday afternoon. (2) John Pekar,

Superintendent of Fairfield County Department of Developmental Disabilities, will speak at our 10/13/21 membership meeting at 7:00 pm, guests from Seton's Updates SVDP are also invited to hear John speak. (3) At the 9/17/21 PARC (Pickerington Area Resource Coalition) meeting, Meals on Wheels gave an update: (a) they still need volunteers for the once per month food box deliveries (two Knights Al and Werner currently volunteer - Thanks), (b) they are working with the American Red Cross (1-844-207-4509) to get free smoke detectors for seniors, (c) they offer a fall prevention course for seniors, and (d) they have a small home projects program for seniors. (4) At the 10/5/21 Fairfield County 211 Hope Committee meeting they gave an update on all the government service agencies in Fairfield County. Overall Fairfield County is meeting the current needs (Franklin County may be struggling). They are now kicking off their Holiday assistance program and may need help with it, more information to come. Their Hunger Action month (September) program was a big success with over 10 sites collecting items, this program is something for Seton to consider joining next year.

Family Director: Chuck Slaby talked about the upcoming Family Fun Festival that has been rescheduled from 10/30/21 to 10/23/21 due to a wedding reception in the PAC, will need 100 pumpkins, plan on having a pumpkin carving contest, Halloween costume parade, and dinner served with bean soup, hotdogs, hamburgers, etc., will send an email as he needs 4 or 5 volunteers to help with the event.

Pancake Breakfast: Frank Hare reported that the Pancake Breakfast was moved from 10/10/21 to 10/17/21. All Pancake Breakfasts will be scheduled for the 3rd Sunday in the month due to SPY Mass being the 2nd Sunday of every month. Plans to send out an email, will need volunteers

Coats for Kids: Tim Lee reported that Dick Petersen is working again with St. Vincent Family Center to donate coats to needy children, Dick may be requesting a donation at the next meeting.

Unfinished Business: None

New Business:

MOTION: Al Kluczynski made a motion to spend \$XXX from the Youth budget to provide two \$XXX scholarships for two youths to attend the National Catholic Youth Conference in Washington DC on 11/18-21/21, 2nd by Jesus Garcia, discussion and voting will occur at the 10/13/21 membership meeting.

MOTION: Dan M. Murphy made a motion to donate \$XXX from the Community budget to Meals on Wheels' new program to help Seniors with small home projects on a cost sharing basis based on their ability to pay, 2nd by Chuck Slaby, discussion and voting will occur at the 10/13/21 membership meeting.

Wayne Patterson reported that 4 new propane tanks have been purchased by the Parish, Frank Hare will check to see if the Council needs to pay half the cost.

Deputy Grand Knight Francis Wilamosky officially closed the meeting at 7:40 pm with prayer. Membership Meeting is scheduled for October 13th at 7 pm, come early as the rosary will be prayed at 6:30 pm.

Chancellor's Corner



In October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is designated as Respect Life Sunday. To support these annual observances, the USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities provides materials to help Catholics understand and value the gift of human life and help build a culture that cherishes and protects it. I encourage all to check out the Respectlife.org web site Respect Life Month for the monthly agenda and other informative materials. This year there is a special emphasis on St. Joseph - Defender of Life!

We also are dedicated to praying the rosary during this month. Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC has written a wonderful book titled - The 10 Mysteries of the Rosary. The following is an excerpt from the book:

"In April 2014, Boko Haram kidnapped more than 200 young girls from a school in Nigeria, Africa. Boko Haram is the notorious radical Muslim group that violently slaughters non-Muslims by such means as decapitation or burning people alive.

In December 2014, Jesus appeared to a Catholic bishop in Nigeria and instructed him that the rosary was the weapon that would overcome Boko Haram. Bishop Oliver Dashe Doeme of the diocese of Maiduguri, Nigeria, claims that one evening, while he was praying his rosary, Jesus appeared to him holding a sword. During the vision, Jesus extended the sword toward the bishop. When the bishop went to take the sword from Jesus, it miraculously transformed into a rosary! Once the bishop had the rosary-sword in his hands, Jesus looked at him and said three times, "Boko Haram is gone! Boko Haram is gone!"

After the bishop of Maiduguri had his vision, he began to promote the rosary in his diocese in Nigeria. In many of his interviews, he repeats his vision and informs his listeners of his interpretation of the vision in the following words: "As soon as I received the sword, it turned into a rosary. I didn't need any prophet to give me the explanation. It was clear that with the rosary we would be able to expel Boko Haram." On October 13, 2016, dozens of kidnapped girls were suddenly released by Boko Haram from captivity. In May 2017, another 83 girls were released. Then, on July 3, 2017, 700 members of Boko Haram surrendered their weapons and turned themselves in to Nigerian authorities.

Many of the mysteries in the book reinforce the understanding of the rosary as just not a nice prayer, but our spiritual weapon. As Knights we should carry our rosary with us always and in our left pocket as we would carry our sword into battle. I hope you will take the time to read all of the mysteries."

Finally during October we focus on supporting the Missions. A special focus would be support for the people of Haiti. The earthquake, according to Catholic Relief Services (CRS), caused major damage to Les Cayes, the country's third-largest city. More than 1,300 have been killed and more than 5,700 injured. According to CNN, the quake leveled 13,694 homes and damaged another 13,785.

The natural calamities follow recovery from the country's 2010 earthquake, Hurricane Matthew in 2016, prolonged drought, the COVID-19 pandemic and political upheaval caused by the July 7 assassination of Jovenel Moise, the Haitian president. Akim Kikonda, CRS' country representative in Haiti reported, "Prior to the earthquake, people here were already struggling to make ends meet. It is quite possible that Haiti is going to need more help than ever before." Contributions can be made to Catholic Charities - Donate to Where It's Needed Most | Catholic Relief Services (crs.org)


