Chaplains Corner

I write this email in two capacities; the Pastor of Seton Parish and your Council's Chaplain. I have asked that our Worthy Grand Knight share it with all of you.

It hardly seems possible that Lent is just around the corner. As you know, the Lenten Season is season of renewal among other themes. It is common that many engage in many devotional practices and are conscious about the spiritual of their lives. At the same time, many are well aware of Lent being, for lack of a better term, the season during which Knights of Columbus Councils and/or Parishes conduct a Fish Fry. The combination of these means that there is a strong hope that many who have not been on our campus, at Masses, or participating in other parish events since the beginning of the pandemic or even before, might return. We have no way of being certain.

It is with understanding that I am asking for your assistance.

While I understand and appreciate that the Fish Fry is probably the Council's biggest fundraiser, I also know it is a social event. This means that it is a prime opportunity as Catholics, parishioners and missionary disciples to see each Friday in which the Council as a whole and each of us individually to engage in what is called the New Evangelization. This means that patrons and all involved have an experience of feeling welcomed and that those whom we may not have seen for quite some time have been missed. This is true for Council Members as Parishioners.

One of the challenges that has come about over the past several years is on how to motivate our brothers and sisters who have become accustomed to doing everything virtually to see that nothing can totally replace the Ministry of Presence and Community.

The Knights are an integral part of Seton Parish and are very generous to the parish in many ways. The Council is more than a Social Club or Civic Group or Fundraising Group. It is also a ministerial group whose ministry promote the Christian and Catholic Faith in communion with the Church and its Dioceses and Parishes. Therefore, each Council is called to remain outward in their focus.

The Council here at Seton is well known for its generosity to the parish whether it be financial support or in its members being active participants in the many and varied ministries and events within the parish. Unfortunately, during some of the years in the priesthood, I have seen some Councils that have been more inward in focus that have concentrated on business activities such as operating social clubs and bars. Participation in the sacramental life of the parish or parishes with which they were connected was minimal. In a sense, Councils became the equivalent of an alternative parish if you will. Spirituality was definitely secondary. Many of these Councils have failed and no longer exist.

In addition, one reality of which all of us need to be aware, is that our parish at present has only two people doing facility work. This means that all of us need to be mindful that set-up, clean-up and many others needs in regard to facilities and maintenance may not be addressed in the same manner as in the past. Your patience and understanding in these needed as is anything that can be done to assist Jim and Mark.

I am praying for all will have a Grace-filled Lent and that the Fish Fry each Friday is a success not only materially but also spiritually.

Plans to have another Membership Drive in March and speak at each of the Masses.

Grand Knight's Report: DGK Francis Wilamosky reported that 8 Knights helped to shovel Tom Wagner's driveway on 2/6/22. Attended the Clergy Dinner on 1/30/22 along with Father Leo, 450 people attended; Wife Appreciation Dinner is moved to May; prices are being raised for the Fish Fries; Fairfield County has 20 different opportunities for volunteering or donating; the 4 free tickets received for being a Silver Sponsor for the Men's and Women's Conference were given to the RICA program, encourage members to attend, meeting in the parking lot at 6:30 am to car pool, more details will be in this week's bulletin.

Chancellor Report: Absent, no report.

Treasurer Report: DJ Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers and program chairs, let him know if there are any questions or if anyone wants the numbers, all bills have been paid, entries have been properly reconciled.

Financial Secretary Report: Frank Hare reported that the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity and the Audit have both been filed. Supreme has a new "Affiliate Member" classification for those Council members who have not paid dues in years which will then be removed from the local Council roster and go on the Supreme Council roster. He discussed a list of 30 members with Council elders and plans to provide 24 names to the GK who then submits them to the District Deputy, needs to occur by 2/28/22.

SK Frank Hare mentioned the off-site formal social event for 4th degree members on Sunday, 3/20/22, going to 9:30 am Mass at Seton, then going out for breakfast and attending the matinee play, "Arsenic and Old Lace", at Pickerington Community Theater with the Assembly paying for the tickets, mark your calendar.

Report on Programs and Committees

Program Director: Bob Coholich submits the reports as he receives them, plans to give more details at the next Business Meeting.

Benevolent: Mike Croyle, no report.

Community Director: Dan Murphy stated that there are a lot of community activities in Fairfield County, has been sending out emails to all Knights in regards to opportunities to learn and help people, for volunteering or donating. Plans to pick up tickets for the Super Cash Bonanza raffle, looking for help in stuffing envelopes.

Church Director: Wayne Patterson, no report.

Family Director: Chuck Slaby reported that the St. Patrick's Dance is 3/19/22, will be promoting Good Friday services, Easter Egg Hunt is the Saturday before Easter, and needs nominations for "Family of the Year" by the end of March, let either him or Thom Laughery know.

Right To Life: Mike Gohr talked about the upcoming "Faithful At the End of Life" program on Tuesday, 2/15/22 at 6:30 pm at Herrmann Hall, contacted all Churches and K of C Councils on the east side, plans to talk at each Mass this weekend. Would encourage everyone to attend.

Pancake Breakfast: Next one is on 2/20/22 after all 3 masses, will need volunteers.

Cinnamon Roll Sale: Chuck Slaby, Mike Gohr, and Mark Decker volunteered to co-chair a Cinnamon Roll Committee, plan to have one 4/24/22 and another in the fall, looking at 500 cinnamon rolls, sell at \$3 each, will need 10 volunteers to help, and do not plan on taking pre-orders for the first one, may consider later.

Fish Fry: Frank Hare reported that the Fish Fry Committee appreciated the comments at the Business Meeting, plan the same offerings and quality of food, and decided to raise the price \$XX for dine-in or carryout fish to \$XX and salmon to \$XX, children ages 6-12 stays at \$XX, macaroni and cheese stays at \$XX, starts 3/4/22, has sign-up sheets for various positions, and needs extra help breaking down tables and chairs at the end of the night, will also need desserts. Field Agent Report: Mike Dippold stated that Knights of Columbus Long Term Care insurance is the best in North America, can apply and no premium commitment until approved by underwriting. Starting 3/1/22, direct surrender withdrawals can be processed on line. The next thing they are looking at is allowing to pay life insurance premiums by credit card. Annuity reports are all sent out at year end rather than on their anniversary date. Tax date is 4/18/22, let him know if you would like to create an IRA for tax savings. Grand Knight Thom Laughery called the meeting to order at 6:31 pm with prayer.

Roll Call of Officers: Roll Call was taken and missing was the Chancellor, 1st Year Trustee and Lecturer, all excused.

Grand Knight: GK Thom Laughery read the email, dated 2/21/22, from Father Leo pertaining to "Food for Thought" that Thom sent to all Council members with several points to focus on, that each Knight should individually engage in what is called the New Evangelization meaning that patrons and all involved have an experience of feeling welcomed and in the ministry of promoting the Christian and Catholic Faith, and helping with set-up, clean-up and other needs in regards to the facilities. When you see Father Leo, thank him for his email comments. As a reminder, the Council protocol requires that all requests pertaining to the Parish need to be brought to the Grand Knight who will then present it to the Council or Trustees/Officers and then the Grand Knight will approach Father Leo or the Office with the request.

Deputy Grand Knight: DGK Francis Wilamosky stated that 25 to 30 guys from Seton attended the Men's Conference on 2/26/22, good turnout, 1700 attendees, speakers were good. Will need Greeters at masses this upcoming weekend, 3/5 and 3/6, wear your Knights shirt. Join us in praying the rosary at 8 am on 3/5/22 in the Chapel for Eucharistic Adoration with Exposition at 8:50 am. The Video Coordinator for the Diocese will be attending our 3/11/22 Fish Fry. Consider attending the 2 day event, "Rescue Project Live" by Father John Riccardo at the Ohio Expo Center on 6/18-19/22.

Treasurer's Report: DJ Murphy sent out the numbers to the Officers and Directors, any questions or if you want to receive a copy, let him know. Everything balances, reconciled and up to date.

Financial Secretary Report: Frank Hare reported that his "Affiliate Member" classification list of 24 Council members who have not paid dues in years had been approved by the Grand Knight, the acting District Deputy and sent to Supreme, once Supreme approves the list, those members will be removed from our Council which will reduce our membership numbers. Have collected \$XXX in 2022 dues, but still waiting for 19 members to pay.

Advocate: Mark Decker has reviewed all the documents as he continues to revise the By-Laws of the Council, plans to update them over the next several weeks, and then the Council can review them prior to having them submitted to Supreme for final approval.

Community Director: Dan Murphy reported that 174 "Super Cash Bonanza" raffle tickets have been sold, first turn in is due later this month, please bring to next week's membership meeting. At a recent board meeting, Jeannette Curtis, Executive Director for Fairfield 2-1-1, gave a shout out to our Council for our members volunteering / participating in some of their programs.

Family Director: Chuck Slaby reported that the St. Patrick's Dance is 3/19/22 and he is working with Dick Petersen on the details; promoting via posters a reminder to attend Good Friday services; Easter Egg Hunt is Saturday, 4/16/22, suggested asking the MOMS Group (Mothers of Ministry) to fill the Easter eggs; and needs nominations for "Family of the Year" by the end of March, does not need to be a Knight.

Fish Fries: Frank Hare talked about the upcoming 6 Fish Fries starting 3/4/22, has 685 portions ready to go, spent \$XXX for supplies thus far, will need desserts by 4:30 pm especially week 2,4,6 as the MOMS Group will do weeks 1,3,5. Four ladies have volunteered to scoop food at 11 am, the Boy Scouts will be selling pop, has sign-up sheets with the biggest need is at 7 pm to break down tables/chairs and clean up, and finally publicize/promote the Fish Fries with others.

MOTION: Dan Murphy made a motion to donate \$XXX to the Knights of Columbus Charities that has launched the "Ukraine Solidarity Fund" to support Ukrainian refugees and will match all funds up to \$500,000, 2nd by Al Kluczynski, discussion and voting will occur at the 3/9/22 membership meeting.

MOTION: Wayne Patterson made a motion to donate \$XXX from the Church Budget for the seminary program called RSVP, Refund Support Vocations Program, with a check sent to Seton's seminarian Zack Goodchild, 2nd by Chuck Slaby, discussion and voting will occur at the 3/9/22 membership meeting.

Jesus Garcia stated that the Fall Festive committee requested that he puts on a Car Show once again at the Seton Parish Fall Festive on Sunday, 8/14/22, discussion will occur at the 3/9/22 membership meeting.

Lecturer Report: GK Thom Laughery read an article on "Every Catholic Should Know: How The Apostles Died" which stated how the 12 Apostles and St. Paul were tormented, prosecuted, faced martyrdom and how they died. He will email a copy of the article to all members so they can reflect on them during Lent.

Grand Knight Thom Laughery officially closed the meeting at 7:58 pm with prayer. Membership Meeting is scheduled for March 9th at 7 pm, come early as the rosary will be prayed at 6:30 pm.
