

### Chancellor's Corner - Waiting Patiently

Thinking about our lives, we can all remember when life just seemed to be slower. Today, our lives feel rushed. Everything we do has to be done quickly and without issue.

Fast food, 10 minute oil changes, grocery store self-checkout and drive thru ATM machines are but a few of the conveniences that have been established to cut our "waiting" time. So why are we so impatient?

Are we also impatient with God? We ask ourselves constantly why we watch the devastation and carnage on the news, people being robbed right on the streets, hate crimes that seem senseless, schools being locked down because someone decided to kill kids indiscriminately, and people we have entrusted to do the right thing constantly ignoring the law, lying about it or applying it as it suits them. Why do these injustices continue? Why won't God just grant our prayers. Where is God to right the wrongs and smite the oppressors? When will it end?

Our feelings of waiting and wondering are not just our trials and tribulations. In the Old Testament, <u>Habakkuk</u> wondered as well and asked God "how long" before justice is done? Habakkuk sees all of this injustice and feels that God isn't listening, and that HE is tolerating wrongdoing. God's answer in Habakkuk 1: 2-4 is:

#### "WAIT FOR IT"

In Psalms 37: 1-9, we are told "Do not fret because of those who are evil or envious of those who do wrong, for like grass they will soon wither, like green plants they will soon die away. Trust in the Lord and do good; dwell in the land and enjoy safe pasture... Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him, do not fret when people succeed in their ways, when they carry out their wicked schemes."
