Chancellor's Corner

Guide to the Mass

Before I discuss the above topic, I want to remind all of you of the upcoming special election on August 8th. It features an update to the Ohio constitution whereby a 60% approval would be needed to change our constitution, instead of the current requirement of 50% plus 1. This special election is to prevent an amendment to the Ohio Constitution that will be voted on in the November ballot, which would effectively allow abortion on demand. Please make sure to mark this date on your calendar, and encourage all of your family and friends to vote YES on August 8th.

THE MASS: Continued

Last month's letter started the explanation of the Meaning of the Mass, as published by the Knights of Columbus from Precious Blood of Christ church in Pawley's Island, SC. This month we continue to the Liturgy of the Word.

The Introductory Rites include the **Entrance, Greeting, Penitential Rite, Gloria and Collect.** This part of the Mass prepares us for the **Liturgy of the Word.**

The Mass begins with a hymn or psalm as the priest enters the sanctuary, he gives reverence to the altar, kisses it, recognizing the sacrifice that Christ made for us. We are

now in a state of prayer and humility focusing on Christ's grace.

The presence of the Lord is amplified with the sign of the cross, as we do everything in the Mass in His name. When the priest says the "Lord is with you", and we answer "and with your spirit", we are indeed recognizing ourselves as a community.

The **Penitential Rite** is our general confession, as a community. The *Confiteor* (Latin for I Confess) or the *Kyrie* (Greek for Lord) come from the ancient Church. As we proceed through this part of the Mass, we are focusing on our sins, sensing a need for God and preparing for the remainder of the Mass. We are asking for forgiveness, and recognize that God loves us despite our sins.

The **Gloria**, an ancient hymn, turns our focus from us and our short comings, to God and the forgiveness we received during the **Penitential Rite.**

Treasurer's Report: DJ Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers, program chairs, and those who requested a copy, let him know if there are any questions or if anyone else wants a copy.

Since fraternal year 2022/23 ended, he sent information to John Siebert, CPA, to file our tax return.

Financial Secretary Report: Frank Hare reported that at the State Tour Meeting that \$XXX was collected for Seminarians, a new program during July and August was passed to raise money for SOS. Produced an updated K of C flyer that can be used for recruitment, sent to officers for review. Paid \$XXX to State and \$XXX to Supreme for per capita requirement. Vote no on the November ballot initiative if passed that would allow abortion on demand in Ohio.

Advocate Report: Mark Decker prepared the 2023-2024 Resolutions that will need to be voted upon this evening.

Warden Report: Scott Huff, no report.

Trustees Report: Jesus Garcia stated that the Trustees and the Grand Knight conducted the semi-annual Audit this evening.

An Honor Guard can be requested for an immediate family member which is wife, children, grandchildren and parents, contact the Grand Knight. Let him know if you have any questions. No date has yet been set for the Fall 4th degree Exemplification. The next meeting is 7/19/23, a Summer Picnic meal being served, any Council member even if not a 4th degree Sir Knight is invited along with their wife for the meal.

Community Report: Dan Murphy has been emailing volunteer opportunities and activities that are available with various organizations in the Pickerington and Fairfield County area, let him know if interested in getting involved.

Lecturer's Reflection

This evening I would like to talk about chaplains. According to the National Association of Catholic Chaplains, a chaplain is, "...a professional who provides spiritual and emotional support to people in many different settings". Chaplains can be found in healthcare, senior care environments, hospice, as well as places like prisons and the military. Some are even found in corporations, colleges, or even youth camps¹. And of course, our very own Fr. Leo Connolly is a chaplain.

Because July 4th was just over a week ago, I'd like to talk specifically about military chaplains. The origins of U.S. military chaplains officially date back to March 4, 1791. However, I'd like to focus on one military chaplain that goes by the name of Fr. Vincent Capodanno. Fr. Capodanno was originally a Maryknoll missionary; the Maryknoll's were and still are focused on foreign missionary work. However, during the Vietnam War, Fr. Capodanno heard the call to become a military chaplain, specifically a U.S. Navy chaplain. After his Maryknoll superiors reluctantly approved his desire to become a military chaplain, Fr. Capodanno became a lieutenant. In fact, Lt. Capodanno wanted to be immediately posted to a Marine combat unit in Vietnam - a request that was granted given his prior missionary experience in Asia. At the time, very few chaplains were assigned to front-line combat units right from Chaplain's school. Granting his wishes, Fr. Capodanno was first assigned to the 7th Marine Regiment near Da Nang.

Fr. Capodanno catered to the men of all faiths. His dedication to the common men-the "grunts"-became legendary. He regularly accompanied his fellow Marines on marches and into action, even when that sort of risk-taking was rare. "I want to be available in the event anything serious occurs," he explained, "to learn firsthand the problems of the men, and to give them moral support, to comfort them with my presence. In addition, I feel I must personally witness how they react under fire—and experience it myself—to understand the fear they feel." Fr. Capodanno was more than a priest ministering within the horrific arena of war. He became a constant companion to the Marines: living, eating, and sleeping in the same conditions of the men. He established libraries, gathered, and distributed gifts, and organized outreach programs for the local villagers. He spent hours reassuring the weary and disillusioned, consoling the grieving, hearing confessions, and instructing converts.

Ultimately, during his second tour on September 4, 1967, with the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, that Fr. Capodanno made the ultimate sacrifice. After hours of heavy fighting from a North Vietnamese ambush, Fr. Capodanno, himself seriously injured, ran to the assistance of a wounded corpsman and the Marine he was assisting who were pinned down by an enemy machine gunner where he administered medical and spiritual attention. Despite being unarmed, the enemy opened fire and Fr. Capodanno, the victim of 27 bullet wounds, died faithfully performing his final act as a good and faithful servant of God³. I think Fr. Capodanno's actions remind us of St. Paul's words to the Corinthians (13:13), "So faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love." I think it would be safe to say that all that Fr. Capodanno did, he did so out of love.

While this reflection was more of a sketch about Fr. Capodanno, if you are interested in more details, I would highly recommend reading, "The Grunt Padre: Father Vincent Robert Capodanno, Vietnam, 1966-1967" by Fr. Daniel L. Mode and Gerald H. Turley.
