Chaplains Report: Absent, no report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Absent, no report.

Grand Knight's Report: GK Francis Wilamosky received a thank you letter from St. Vincent Family Center for the 185 coats donated to needy children during our K of C Coat Drive. Thanked Brother Knights that participated in presenting the Seton Staff with the Christmas basket. Murphy had gotten information on the Fairfield County United Way Polar Plunge fund raiser at Buckeye Lake on 1/29/23.

Deputy Grand Knight: DGK Dick Petersen has ordered 5 new plaques for the Memorial Stone, price has increased from \$XXX to \$XXX each.

Treasurer Report: DJ Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers, directors and those that requested a copy, let him know if there are any questions or if you want a copy, entries have been properly reconciled. Lecturer's Reflection

There is a parable in Luke, about a fig tree in a vineyard that has not grown fruit in three years and the master of the vineyard says it should be cut down. The parable is as follows, "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said the vinedresser, 'Behold, these three years I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down; why should it use up the ground? And he answered him, 'Let it alone, sir, this year also, till I dig about it and put on fertilizer. And if it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'" So why the talk about fruitless fig trees and fertilizer? One way this passage can be understood is that it is about grace.

Grace is a word we hear many, many times but have you ever stopped to think about what grace actually is. According to The Catechism of The Catholic Church (hereafter referred to as the Catechism), grace is defined as, "the free and undeserved gift that God gives us to respond to our vocation to become his adopted children. As sanctifying grace, God shares his divine life and friendship with us in a habitual gift, a stable and supernatural disposition that enables the soul to live with God, to act by his love. As actual grace, God gives us the help to conform our lives to his will. Sacramental grace and special graces (charisms, the grace of one's state of life) are gifts of the Holy Spirit to help us live out our Christian vocation."

Based on the definition of grace in the Catechism, we can understand the parable and use of fertilizer in two ways: as sanctifying grace and as actual grace.

First, fertilizer as sanctifying grace. In §1999 of the Catechism, sanctifying grace is received in Baptism and is *the gratuitous gift that God makes to us of his own life, infused by the Holy Spirit into our soul to heal it of sin and to sanctify it*. As we read in the parable, the fig tree is dead and that is the condition of our soul prior to Baptism, dead. After Baptism, our soul becomes alive. In the case of actual trees and fertilizer, fertilizer can help bring a tree back to life.

Second, fertilizer as actual grace. What is interesting about actual grace is that it can precede sanctifying grace - this can be seen in adults who have not been baptized but desire baptism. Also, actual grace is present when we desire reconciliation with God after committing any mortal sin. Actual grace is not a one-time event, but present as needed. For example, anytime the thought to pray, the thought to go to adoration, or even to read Scripture pops into our head, that is actual grace. So actual grace is like fertilizer in that fertilizer is present and benefits the plant as needed.

As wonderful as grace is, we must always remember that we do not merit grace at all; grace is a gift from God. Let us recall a portion of St. Paul's letter to Titus: *...but when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of deeds done by us in righteousness, but in virtue of his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal in the Holy Spirit, which he poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life.*

Remember, grace in our soul is our soul sharing in the divine life of God. How amazing is it that the God of all creation, Creator of all that is visible and invisible, shares His divine life with us?! That is why grace is so valuable!
