Chancellor's Corner - OUR CHURCH

A few years ago, we can all remember going to Mass in the PAC while our church was being renovated. What we may not have known was some of the background as to how the renovation was started, and the thought process behind it. I want to thank Frank Hare for bringing this Renovation Story, dated 7/30/23, to my attention. It is 64 pages long. As a result, I am going to take a small part and discuss it here.

The intent of the committee, utilizing the teachings of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church CCC 1180*, was to plan this project to "create a space that reflects the sacred nature of the Mass and Eucharist." "Christians construct buildings for divine worship,...churches are not simply gathering places but signify and make visible the Church living in this space, the dwelling of God with men."

Vatican II guided the committee as it dealt with artwork and architecture. Artwork should be composed of signs and symbols of heavenly realities, per the Sacrosanctum Concilium. Architecture would be guided by *Built of Living Stone, Architecture and Worship*, written by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. It instructs on how to design places of worship that are dignified, beautiful and suited to the sacred celebrations.

So, look around at some of the features of the Church as you worship and try to understand the thought process behind each piece of artwork, and how the design reflects the committee's intent.

Lecturer's Reflection

Every time we recite the Nicene Creed, there is a portion that states: ... God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father...

In the Gospel of John (10:30), Jesus says, "I and the Father are one." And later in the same chapter (10:38), he reemphasis, "that the Father is in me and I am in the Father.

Tonight I want to focus on "consubstantiation," what it is, and why it matters. According to Pat McClosky, OFM, consubstantial is, "simply one possible translation of the Latin equivalent of the Greek term

homoousios (literally, "the same substance"). This term was not added to the Nicene Creed; rather, it makes this the Nicene Creed. In AD 325, at the Council of Nicaea, the bishops of the Catholic Church were invited by Emperor Constantine to gather at Nicaea in modern-day Turkey to address an extremely controversial issue raised by Arius, an Egyptian priest. The bishops took an existing creed used at Baptism and inserted the term homoousios.

Arius and his followers claimed that Jesus did not share the same substance as God the Father; the vast majority of bishops at Nicaea said that Jesus did. For many years, English-speaking Catholics used a translation that included the phrase "of one substance with the Father." Since 2012, the official text reads, "consubstantial with the Father." The belief that Jesus did not share the same substance as God the

Father is known as the Arian heresy.

This may or may not be well known, but the Arian heresy lives on in modern times by way of Jehovah's Witnesses. In John 1:1, we read, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.." The translation of the Bible the Jehovah's Witnesses use translates John 1:1 as, "...The Word was a God." According to them, Jesus was a lesser god, but not the Almighty God. This is not meant to go deep into the Arian heresy and other heresies, but what is interesting is heresies tend to be Scripture based - but that is for another time.

My brothers, every time we recite the Nicene Creed and say "consubstantial," we reemphasize that Jesus was not only man, but divine, of the same substance as God the Father. This is not a teaching the early Church made up because it sounded good - they taught it because it is true. The early Creeds are one connection with the early Church and we recite the words they recited. In fact, the Creeds are the earliest way the faith was taught and promulgated; the Creeds are a unifier of our beliefs. The words recited in the Creeds are not just words to mindlessly recite, but are the beliefs, our beliefs, that our many brothers and sisters in Christ were (and are) martyred for - do not pay lip service to these words we recite.
