Received an email from Father Leo about a Brother Knight who is trying to raise funds for plane travel to Togo, Africa for the burial of his father, estimated cost is \$XXX, suggesting we may want to take up an induvial collection to help him defray some of his costs. With Trustees approval, he would like to appoint Werner Christian as our new Warden for Council 11187. Received a letter pertaining to sponsoring the Women's Catholic Conference on 2/17/24 and the Men's Catholic Conference on 2/24/24.

Lecturer's Reflection

In the secular world via the media, a man's worth is defined by his prowess in the bedroom, his job, and how good he is at sports. However, our faith tells us that our worth is inherent due to our dignity as humans and this is bestowed upon us by God, **not** by the world. It's easy to believe this intellectually. In fact, it's extremely easy to believe that intellectually. What can be hard is to believe in our soul that we have worth. I have struggled with this from time to time...and I'm willing to bet some of you have felt this way before too. I sometimes have felt like I had less worth because I did not serve in the military or in public service (e.g., police officer, firefighter). Many of you have done many things that are considered worthwhile in the eyes of the public – and in my eyes too. But this is not meant to be a "woe-is-me" reflection.

Because we are in the season of Advent, we remember that this is the season when Our Lord God deigned to become flesh, to become one of us, for the sake of salvation and forgiveness. And that is what Advent is truly about – God descending to earth and taking on our humanity. Why did God do this? Because "for God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). It's easy to generalize that God loves us so much. **But God does. love. you.** The point is that God loved you so much, he was willing to take on our humanity to be an example of how to have faith, how to have hope, and how to love.

But why would an all-powerful and all-knowing God have any love for us? Many in the secular world will say that God does not love or care. In fact, I would say that many people view God in the same manner that the pagans viewed their gods, that the gods did not really consider the plight of mankind; that mankind was beneath their concern. Now some will say that there were gods that cared for mankind, but in general, the head god did not really care about humans. An often cited example of this is if you stepped on an ant, would you care at all? Would you feel a sense of loss? Most likely you wouldn't. So it is the same with pagan gods and humanity. But with our God, the True God, this is not the case. The Catechism tells us (§616), "It is love "to the end"¹ that confers on Christ's sacrifice its value as redemption and reparation, as atonement and satisfaction. He knew and loved us all when he offered his life..."²

If you question God's love of yourself and your worth, reflect on what the Psalmist said, "when I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars which you established; what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him? Yet you have made him little less than the angels, and you have crowned him with glory and honor" (Psalm 8:3-5).

In closing, because it is Advent season, I'd like to recite part of a Christmas poem call "Noel" that J.R.R. Tolkien wrote, dedicated to the Virgin Mary:

Glad is the world and fair this night
With stars about its head,
And the hall is filled with laughter and light,
And fires are burning red.
The bells of Paradise now ring
With bell of Christendom,
And Gloria, Gloria we will sing
That God on earth is come.³

So my brothers, why Advent? Because you matter and are worth it.
