Chancellor's Corner - HAVING PATIENCE

I wrote about patience last year, called Waiting Patiently. This view of patience will focus more on the outcomes of our lack of patience.

When the Israelites were freed from Egypt, and wandered in the wilderness, God provided them with healing, food and water, and promised them an arrival at the Promised Land. What was their response? They questioned why they were allowed to suffer and wander without end.

In Numbers 21: 4-9, "...But the people grew impatient on the way; and said Why have you brought us out of Egypt to die in the wilderness?... Then the Lord sent venomous snakes among them; they bit the people and many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, we sinned when we spoke against the Lord and against you. Pray that the Lord will take the snakes away from us."

In our experience, we may not have to come to grips with snakes when we question and have little faith. An experience you may have had with your children while on a journey is their wanting to know, "are we almost there", "we're hungry or thirsty". They're not happy with the journey but are impatient for the arrival. Don't be in a hurry, as "hurry" can cause worry and bad things to happen.

Lecturer's Reflection

We read and hear many times that as Christians, we are to bear our cross daily (Luke 9:23). In Luke (14:27), Jesus says, "Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me, cannot be my disciple," and in Matthew (10:38), "...and he who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me." We also read in the synoptic Gospels that as Jesus carries his cross toward Golgotha for his crucifixion, Simon of Cyrene was pulled from the crowd to carry the cross with Jesus. Lastly, Paul in his letter to the Galatians (6:2) exhorts, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ." Although Jesus tells us to bear our own crosses, Paul encourages us to bear the crosses of each other too.

My reflection back in August 2022 was about confession, which includes the following portion: *Paul makes it pretty clear we are spiritually one body. If we are each a living stone in the body of the Church, our sins weaken our stones with cracks. If our stone is weakened, it becomes difficult to spiritually support each other and it is possible that we can cause others to become weakened.*

I would like to address how important it is for us to pray for each other, especially in times of suffering and/or difficulties. Because we are spiritually one body and are living stones in the body of the Church, when we pray for each other, we are spiritually bearing the cross with those who are suffering - we are helping to build up the body of the Church, not weaken it (as sinning does).

In early January, I was let go from my job. Instead of keeping this new cross to myself, I let people know and asked them to keep me in their prayers that I may find meaningful work. I felt no shame in asking for others to pray for me. But what I was asking for in these prayers was for others to share in carrying this particular cross with me, that I may suffer well - I am not so proud to refuse the help of others because we are united in Jesus and therefore are united with each other.

There is a phrase that I absolutely loathe, and it is "suck it up buttercup." In my opinion, this is one of the least Christian phrases I can think of. I have heard this phrase many times and even when it's not directed towards me, I cannot stand it because in essence, it's telling the person, "it's your problem, not mine, and no one wants to hear your troubles." Instead of spurning someone because of their troubles, bear the cross with them because when any one of us suffers, spiritually we all suffer. Bear each others crosses in faith, in hope, and with love, because doing so fulfills the law of Christ.
