Lecturer's Corner

Instead of making a resolution that you will give up on quitters day (January 10th 2025), space why not try to improve one of the 7 gifts given to you by the Holy Spirit. A new year's resolution doesn't have to be doing something to improve our physical self. It can be an opportunity to grow closer to our Lord and strengthen our resolve to follow His example through the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Wisdom: Knowing right from wrong and making holy choices. **Understanding**: Tolerance, sympathy, and compassion for others.

Counsel: Judgment, prudence, and guidance.

Knowledge: Deepening our understanding of divine things.

Fortitude: Strength and courage to live a holy life.

Piety: Reverence and devotion to God.

Fear of the Lord: Awe and respect for God's presence.

Try saying the Veni Creator Spiritus prayer daily to invoke the help of the Holy Spirit in you life. Veni Creator Spiritus is a poetic prayer that asks for the Holy Spirit to come upon our lives. We ask for His blessings and guidance that we may not fall astray from His paths.

This poem is also included in the 33-day method of prayer and meditation suggested by St. Louise de Montfort. The method is called "Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary". But even if you're not a practitioner of this method, the faithful may also say this at the beginning any deep prayer to venerate the Holy Spirit.

Veni Creator Spiritus

Come, O Creator Spirit blest! And in our souls take up Thy rest; Come with Thy grace and heavenly aid, To fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

Oh, may Thy grace on us bestow The Father and the Son to know, And Thee, through endless times confessed, Of both, the eternal Spirit blest.


