Meditation for July 2025

Confidence in our Father

For July I found the following Meditation from the Magnificat which fits well with the theme of trusting in God for July

A few years ago, the meditation I chose for this day was by Kimberly Hahn, the popular Catholic convert, author, and speaker, whom I also have the privilege of knowing. Though from a book on family life, the text fit this passage well, encouraging us to trust the wisdom of our heavenly Father in the midst of suffering we don't understand or feel we deserve. "Our heart may protest," she wrote, "he cannot be both all -powerful and all-loving if he will not change the situation or person causing me or my child so much pain. Erroneously we lament that, even though God weeps with us, he is not powerful enough to change our circum-stances. Or he can change our situation but chooses not to because he really does not love us." In reality, she continued, "neither explanation describes our heavenly Father, who is both all-loving and all-powerful.... God alone knows all things. In his divine providence he wills only our good from a heart of love deeper than we can know or understand." Reminding us of the love shown by sending his Son to the cross for our redemption, the meditation assured us: "God is at work for our good in the midst of the depths of suffering we are enduring. His Spirit leads us on our journey through suffering to hope.... You may not know the outcome of your suffering. But you can know that in everything God works for good with those who love him, who are called according to his purpose (Rom 8:28). Even when others intend evil, God is still in control."

Onward and upward

This month, in the midst of the sufferings and crosses we face, may the Lord bless us with greater faith in his presence. One day, by his mercy, we will see how all the contradictions and sufferings of our life served our transformation in Christ, who now lives in glory—and who gave his life so that we could do the same.

My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so.

But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you.

Health Corner - Importance of Staying Hydrated

- 1) During hot Summer days, dehydration can cause heat stroke: Outdoor activities, like yard work, jogging, walking around Kings Island or Cedar Point, cause us to sweat. Sweating is the body's way of cooling itself. On really hot days, when we don't drink enough fluids to replace those lost from sweat, our body cannot cool itself sufficiently. Our body produces less sweat because it doesn't have the extra fluids it needs to make us sweat. This can lead to heatstroke: a body temperature above 104 degrees Fahrenheit which causes confusion, dizziness and eventually loss of consciousness. There is nothing more avoidable that can put a damper on your Caribbean vacation, Bahamas cruise, or Las Vegas vacation like dehydration.
- 2) <u>Dehydration can cause heart problem</u>: The human heart needs fluids and electrolytes to pump effectively. If we become dehydrated, it can cause a loss of the electrolytes our heart needs on a daily basis (like magnesium and potassium). This can cause heart palpitations and a high heart rate (tachycardia).
- 3) Chronic dehydration can cause kidney issues: Your kidneys need water to help filter the blood in your body. Dehydration impedes kidney function and can lead to kidney stones. The best way to defend against developing kidney stones is daily proper hydration. Proper hydration can also help prevent urinary tract infections, especially for women. Guys, take care of your wives and make sure they drink plenty of fluids if the get UTI's easily.
- 4) If you are a hard stick for an IV or a blood draw, proper hydration can make it easier for the healthcare worker who administers the IV: Ask any nurse, medical assistant, or phlebotomist: dehydration makes sticking a person much more difficult. So, if you have tiny or deep veins be sure to hydrate well at least 24-48 hours before donating blood, your annual physical, or a medical surgery or procedure.

Tips on staying well hydrated

Carry a water bottle with you wherever you go (choose a water bottle with your favorite sports team, or decorate one with stickers like my family does, to make it more appealing)

If you don't like the taste of water than flavor it with lemon, lime, or sugar free add-ins like Crystal Lite or Propel

Set a reminder on your phone or watch every day to drink some water

Drink at least eight 8-ounce glasses of water a day (about half a gallon)

If you are very active or get kidney stones easily make it twelve 8-ounce glasses a day

Try coconut water also if you are prone to kidney stones (coconut water is rich in citrate which helps prevent them)

Gatorade and many other sports drinks have a high sodium content, so avoid these if you have kidney problems/kidney stones
