Membership Meeting Notes - 14 May 2025

Grand Knight Chuck Slaby called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with a prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain, Chancellor and Warden, all excused. Dick Petersen made a motion to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, 2nd by Francis Wilamosky. Voted upon and passed.

Chaplain Report: Absent, no report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Mark Decker welcomed new member, Sergio Martinez, and transfer Joe Wisniowski who were at the meeting. Reported that 9 new members plus one transfer attended the last Exemplification on 4/10/25 at his home. Has 7 more candidates, their application has been read. application for JD Postage, motion was made by George Bartos and seconded by Dick Petersen to approve the applicant as read, voted and candidate accepted. Father Leo has approved holding Exemplifications quarterly in the church, families invited, with a reception held in Herrmann Hall following. The Exemplifications will be at 12:30 pm on a Sunday, listed the dates on the FY 2025/26 calendar. Field Agent, Gregory Dowdell, plans to sponsor pizza at the first one. Would like to give all new members their first K of C shirt, send your comments to Mark pertaining to this proposal.

Grand Knight Report: GK Chuck Slaby stated that this evening's meeting was moved to the PAC since the preschool program was using Herrmann Hall. Wives Appreciation Dinner is this Saturday, 5/17/25. As listed in the May Newsletter, "Safe Environment Compliance Evening" will be held 6/4/25 in Classroom 7 & 9. Anyone working with children in the Parish need to be trained in "Protecting God's Children" and completing a background check. We need more Knights trained so they could assist at the Easter Egg Hunt, Family Fun Festival, Breakfast with Santa, Free Throw Contest, Portsmouth Food Drive, etc. The Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director and Community Director need to be trained, good for 3 years for these Knights.

Council Officer Duties

Gentlemen, the time has come for our election of officer's for the next fraternal year. Many ask at this time, of the duties of the positions. These are listed here below for your consideration.

Not included here, Financial Secretary and Lecturer, are appointed by either the Grand Knight or Supreme.

For any of you who wish to eventually attain the position of Grand Knight, a good practice (but, not a requirement) is to hold all offices.

This aids you in directing your officers once in the top spot.

Grand Knight: The Grand Knight is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, appoints a membership and programming director, convenes officers for a monthly meeting, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn. The Grand Knight is a member of the Advisory Board with general supervision of the council's Columbian Squire circle.

Deputy Grand Knight: The Deputy Grand Knight is second in command. He assists the Grand Knight with council affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a council meeting, the Deputy Grand Knight presides. He is chairman of the council's retention committee and also a member of the Advisory Board charged with overseeing the council's sponsored Columbian Squires circle.

Chancellor: The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in council activities. The Chancellor is chairman of the admission committee and a member of the Columbian Squires circle ceremonial team

Recorder: The Recorder is similar to a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.

Advocate: The Advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council by-laws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws, Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting, and Robert's Rules of Order.

Warden: The Warden is the 'watchdog' for council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the financial secretary, treasurer and recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. During ceremonial exemplifications, he will appoint and supervise guards.

Inside/Outside Guards: The Guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

Board of Trustees: The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the Grand Knight, who serves as chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight serve on the council's retention committee. During council elections, only the Three-year Trustee is voted on, with the others moving on to become two and one-year trustees, respectively.


