March Reflection

March begins again our yearly faith journey to walk with Christ through His life and teaching toward His eventual suffering, death, and resurrection. Beginning each year, we are asked to try to grow closer to Christ through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. While these are the methods used, they are not intended to be an end in themselves. While they may make us feel better, lose some weight, bring a smile to a person in need (all noble acts) these should not be our goal for the season. The goal should be to walk with Christ and grow closer to Him, to try and understand better His infinite love for us which culminated in His dying such a horrible death on the cross.

The discipline of Lent is to participate every day of the season at least with a short morning and evening prayer. There are 2 days of fasting for those 18 - 60 yrs. old - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and abstinence every Friday from meat. Seach the great Catholic prayer apps such as Hallow, Ascension, Acts XXIX and EWTN to join their Lenten programs.

Let us spend this Lent growing closer to our Lord and increasing in the many spiritual graces He is ready to give us on our journey. Take time to regularly come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation to help heal our souls. May all these bring us to gloriously experience His Resurrection on Easter morning.
