Membership Meeting Notes - September 10, 2025

Grand Knight Chuck Slaby called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dick Petersen asked for a moment of silence for Charlie Kirk of Turning Point USA who was assassinated this afternoon in Utah, followed by a prayer.

Prior to the start of the meeting, representatives from Seton's St. Vincent de Paul spoke. Pat Wallace thanked the Knights for our support, let them know if any family is in need, they make visits to homes of those in need, dollars collected are up 30%, but the need is still great, shared the new area that Seton Parish covers. Mike Myers then spoke of their fund raiser, 4 tickets for The Ohio State & UCLA football game on 11/15/25, \$10 each, only 500 tickets, 2 names will receive 2 tickets plus over \$100 in OSU mdse., drawing will be 10/19/25. Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain, Chancellor, Outside Guard and 1st & 3rd Year Trustees, all excused. The Deputy Grand Knight position is open. Ralph Blamer made a motion to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, 2nd by Dick Petersen. Voted upon and passed.

Membership and Reading of Applications: George Bartos, currently have 290 members as of 8/31/25, no change and no Honorary Life for the month. Health Corner - October 2025

October -Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Brother Knights, how many of us know someone personally (either a co- worker, friend, or family member) who has battled breast cancer? These women are true fighters and sometimes the Lord calls them home from the battle. The Lord has blessed us with modern medicine and many options to fight breast cancer. A key for success can be early detection. With mammogram breast cancer screening technology, that early detection is very possible. According to the American Cancer Society, mammograms are almost 90% effective at catching cancer. John Hopkins Medicine recommends women begin getting mammograms at age 40. However, if there is family history of breast cancer they recommend that women talk with their doctor about getting mammograms at an earlier age.

Please encourage the women in your life to schedule their annual mammograms, especially if they have been putting it off. Female patients at the hospital have told me that many women can find mammograms to be uncomfortable, so please be understanding yet persistent if they are putting theirs off.

If you know someone who has breast cancer (or any form of cancer), please pray for them and ask for the intercession of Saints Peregrine (any cancer type) and Saint Agatha of Sicily (specifically for breast cancer).
